**THE POLITICAL MAN.**  
Keynote State Democratic Convention at Harrisburg.

**ON National Pleading Ground.**  
The above is the highly suggestive title of two papers on immigration in The North American Review, one by Commissioner of Immigration John H. Weber, the other by Charles Stuart Smith, president of the New York chamber of commerce.

Both take the ground that immigration is desirable, and that the right kind of people, instead of being imported, should be recruited from the native stock. We want new foreigners, for one thing, to do the heavy and rough labor which the American, German and Irishmen have comparatively shunned. Other things, Mr. Smith says the earnings of foreigners in the republic, even at the rate of a dollar a day, amount to \$600,000,000 a year. There are 10,000,000 foreigners in the country, and these three weeks ago, a crowd of immigrants such as are now talked of had been placed on immigration years ago the public works of the United States would have been retarded a quarter of a century.

Carnegie has given millions of dollars to his adopted country in benevolent works, besides enriching it to an even greater amount in his manufacturing business, yet not so many years ago Carnegie was a poor lad in Scotland.

Mr. Weber says it is a mistake that the sums of Europe pour their population upon us. "The constitutional vagaries of the European nations," he says, "and the sums there are seldom stirred up so that their 'fill is being sung' as you say. Two-thirds of the immigrants go to farms in the west. At the labor bureau in New York, where three weeks ago we were seeking servant girls for every one that arrives, and letters asking for such help come constantly from all over the country. If the labor were drawn as an active element already in the north, to be then at the next season, instead of congratulating at our rapid growth, a national level and wall would rise.

But conditions ought to be fixed for the immigration of immigrants either through Canada or the seaports. The leading ones Mr. Weber designates below:

Perfect existing schemes where they are possible.

Continue a rigid inspection at our ports, and require a certificate of health for the putting up of laws at our seaports will drive the current of immigration to Canada.

**An American Negro Settlement.**  
The exodus of negroes from the south to Oklahoma set in early this spring. Late a colony of 100 families from Mississippi county, Ark., were sent to a station on the Iron Mountain road, near Broken, waiting for transportation. Large numbers of the colored people were in the new territory when it was first opened up. The settlement of this one spot has been more general among the negroes than to any other one place recently. There are now many thousands of negroes in Oklahoma.

Meanwhile at a mass meeting of Chicago negroes, called to denounce the lynchings of their people that have lately occurred in various localities, many of those present refused to sing "My Country, 'Tis of Thee," because they said this was not a land of liberty for them. Why not let the blacks have part of a state to themselves, where they can show, unmolested by white people, of what civilization the negro is capable?

In a black settlement all would be equal, and all would have a chance to work. This is a large country, and white men would not grudge to the blacks the room, ample room, to make this experiment.

It is a dangerous thing for a king to meddle with the government, as young emperor William of Germany is finding out. Old Emperor William was better. He simply appeared at public affairs, looked fatherly and left the public affairs to his ministers. Thus he lived to be a state, and his death did not possibly in his bed, lamented by all his people.
