

A SUIT FOR \$10,000.

DAMAGES CLAIMED BY MRS. KELLY FROM THE CITY.

Since the Fall on an icy sidewalk at the foot of Blinn's Hotel—The Case Heard Yesterday—Plainfield.

Mrs. Kelly, who brought suit against the city and Jacob Blinn for \$10,000 damages for injuries sustained in her fall, yesterday lost her case. The case was regarded by the Mayor as one of great importance to the city, not only because of the heavy damages which a jury might award in this particular case it was decided in favor of the plaintiff, but because of the fact that if the city were held liable for damages for injuries sustained on its sidewalks, it would thereby be subjected to a heavy burden. If parties injured by falling on icy sidewalks may resort to the city for damages for injuries sustained, it would be a heavy burden on the city, and it is not probable that the city would be able to pay the damages. Accordingly, the city's case was prepared with great care.

At the close of the evidence offered by the plaintiff, Corporation Counsel, C. A. Marsh, handed to the court a printed brief discussing the question of the liability of the city, and also the question of the liability of the abutting property owner.

His position was that if there were any duty on the part of the city, it was to the public for violation of which the city would be liable by indictment or presentment of the Grand Jury.

The court held that the city was not liable in any event and directed that the plaintiff be non-suited so far as the city was concerned.

As to the other point, he said he could hear counsel further when the case went to the jury.

Mr. Marsh immediately replied that if the court had any doubt upon this point there was another ground of non-suit which could not possibly admit of question, viz: that plaintiff had failed to show that defendant Blinn owed the property injured a duty which he had possession of the same.

The court quickly assented to this view of the case and granted the motion non-suit with costs.

LAING'S HOTEL.

AN OLD HISTORIC LANDMARK TO BE REMOVED.

Over \$50,000 to be Expended in Improving the Place—It becomes a Fine Investment.

Laing's Hotel, which, as announced in the News of yesterday, has been purchased by Mr. George H. Babcock, from the First National Bank, for the sum of \$50,000, is to be removed into the site street, a continuation of Madison avenue, and converted into flats.

Laing's Hotel was erected on the present site in 1850, and has continued a more or less popular hotel since the present year, when the death of Mr. John W. Laing, the owner, and the removal of the Miller Brothers, the lessees, brought the corner as a hotel to an end.

In its place on Front street Mr. Babcock is to put a row of five brick flats buildings with stores.

Laing's Hotel is to be leveled level to the sidewalk and made into a square.

The hotel's value will be permitted to remain as a hotel to an end.

"New Jersey enjoys the distinction of being the first State in the Union to incorporate manual or industrial training into the schools by legislative enactment supplemented by liberal State aid."
