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EMERGENCY HINTS.

Some valuable information that every person should thoroughly know.

If a foreign medicine enter the ear, under no consideration was you to apply to it. Pour a little sweet oil into the ear and hold it there. Should the foreign body be moved it will float to the top and can easily be removed. Should it be a hard substance a stream of warm water from a syringe will melt it. Do not, always, hold the affected side toward the floor. Should these methods fail consult a physician. Never probe the ear. Many people are suffering from great affliction caused by thus injuring the ear drum.

To remove food bodies in the nose instruct the child to take a deep, full breath. The unobstructed nostril should be held and the child told to breathe hard through the nose. Should this fail make a hook with a piece of fine wire, and if the object is in sight pull it out.

Never tamper with the eyes. It is always safer to put them in the care of the best oculist.

A sound slap on the back with the flat of the hand will often relieve a whooping cough when obstructed. If not relieved after several slaps send for a physician. Do not slap the child. The slap should be given and reversed. This seems a harsh treatment, but it is nearly always effective.

To convulsions strip the child as quickly as you can and put it into a hot bath. Use your elbow as a test. If your elbow can stand the temperature of the water you may safely put the child in. After the child is in the bath pour cold water gently on the head. This should bring the child out of the convulsion in a few minutes. In any event, an injection of warm salt and water should always be given. If no relief is obtained by these measures get a mustard plaster made with one part mustard and three of flour, up and down the spine. Be careful not to blister. Vaseline the surface after taking off the plaster. Always be sure for your physician, because the child will need treatment after the attack passed off. A great point is to keep the child quiet.

After periods of any kind has been taken give an emetic, such as 10 cc of ground vomiting. A dessert spoonful of ground mustard in a cup of warm water, poured into the mouth, followed by a glass of warm water, will force vomiting. A good way to provoke the vomiting is to tickle the back of the throat with a feather. In all cases send for a physician without loss of time.
