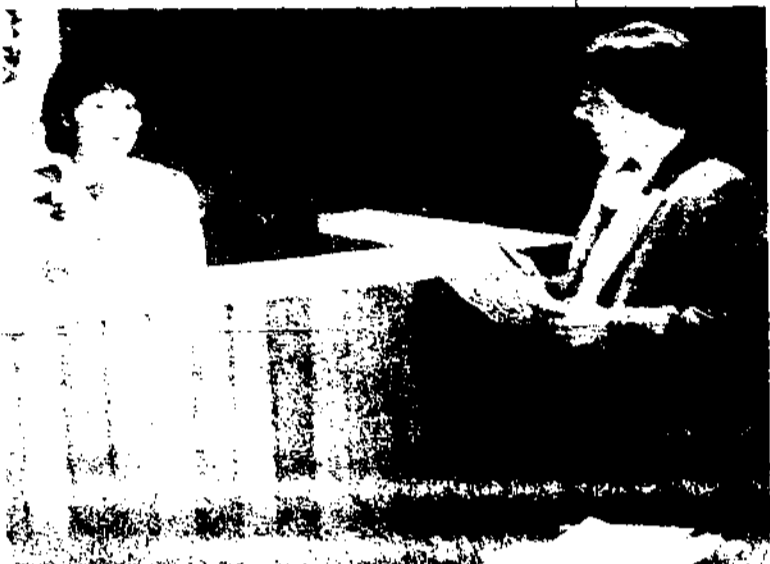

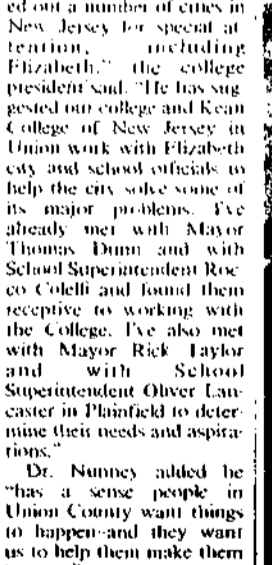

Looking on is Democratic Rep. James Oberstar, of Minnesota, who so chaired the hearing with Rep. Rinaldo. Commissioner Coleman was a witness at the session, sponsored by the Northeast Midwest Congressional Coalition. The coalition is made up of members of Congress from the 19 states in the northeast and midwest.

The legislator noted while the overall supply of home heating oil is about 4 percent less than what it was at this time last year the supply on the East Coast is more than 20 percent below 1983 levels. "I am concerned a sustained cold spell could not only lead to another drastic increase in prices, but might even result in a severe oil shortage which could result in the closure of schools, businesses, and industry in our region," he declared. DOE and oil industry representatives at the hearing said they believe heating oil supplies will be adequate this winter and prices will be reasonably stable.

Dr. Nunney reported the state board of higher education has approved the merger of Union College and the Union County Technical Institute in 1985. He said the college is preparing a master plan by next spring. "A number of task forces last year collected extensive data and prepared preliminary reports," Dr. Nunney said. "These data have now been reviewed and an analysis has been made of what still needs to be done to complete a master plan," the county college president said.
