## Brant Avenue property sold for \$205,000

Property formerly used as a recreation center located on Brant Avenue was sold to the only bidder, Gerald J. Glendon, for \$205,000 at the Clark Municipal Council meeting held on June 16.

The sale by bid was advertised on two occasions with a minimum set at \$200,000.

Edward Padusniak was honored by the Council with a resolution commending his 25 years of service.

A resolution was approved supporting Assembly Bill Number A-994 which would provide all members of Volunteer Fire Departments and Volunteer Emergency Signals with a \$1000 exemption on their State of New Jersey Income Tax.

Plenary Retail Contamination License, Plenary Retail Distribution License and Club Licenses, effective as of July 1, were renewed upon payment of the respective fees of \$600, \$300 and \$60.

A resolution was approved urging swift passage of the legislative package to provide for insurance reform for local governmental agencies including the creation of an Excess Liability Fund.

The issuance of a purchase order to Absolute Fire Protection Company, Inc. was authorized in the amount of \$7,493 for the purchase of a diesel generator to be installed on a fire utility truck already ordered from the same company.

Turns from Cellar Avenue onto Lake Avenue will be restricted to right turns only for a period of thirty days beginning July 1. A resolution urging the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders to conduct a study and to assume the funding for a traffic light at the intersection of Cellar and Lake Avenue was approved.

In other business, the Council:

Approved an ordinance retaining a portion of Parkway Drive to become Waterway Lane.

Amended an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Fix Minimum and Maximum Salaries."

Amended an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Establishing Positions, Salaries, and Duties Under the Provisions of Civil Service."

Amended an ordinance entitled "Police Department."

Amended an ordinance entitled "Stop Intersections."

Approved an ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Township Clerk to execute an agreement with Union County to modify the Interlocal Services Agreement.

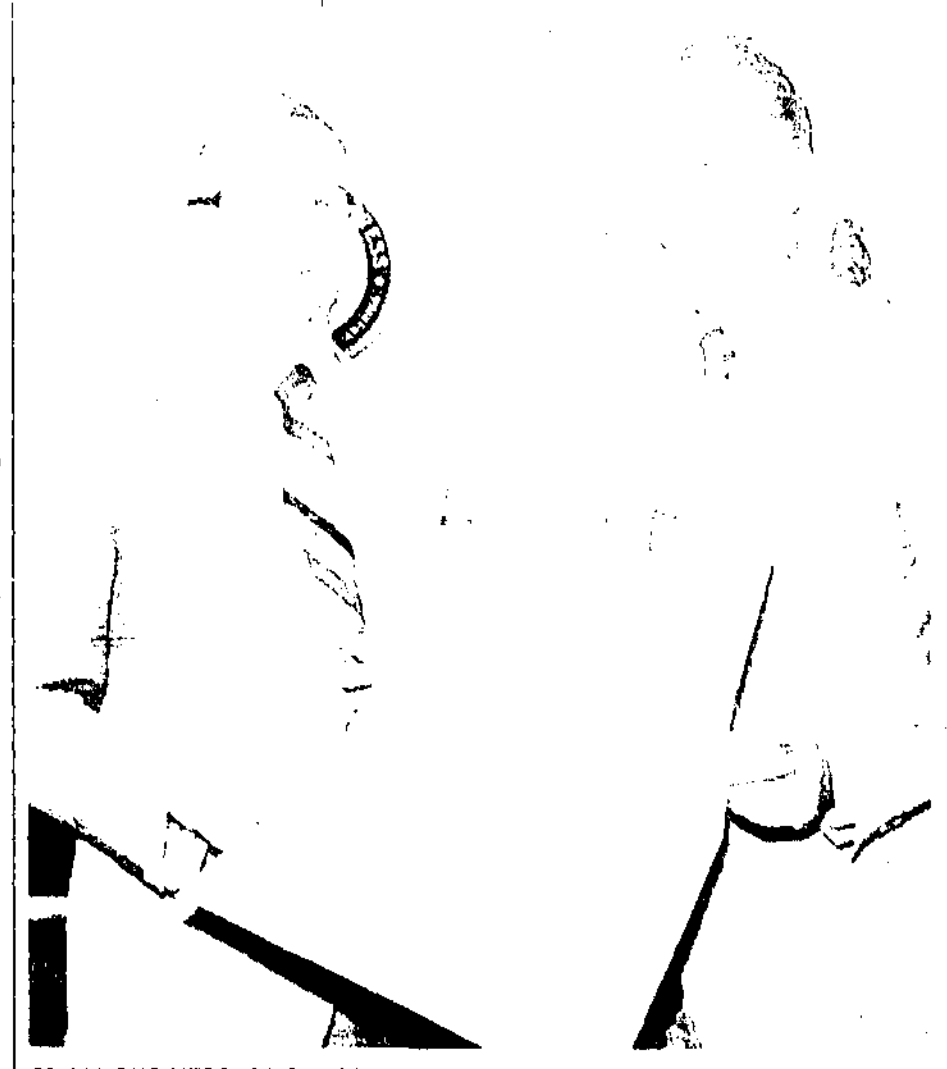
