Mother Seton seniors receive over \$500,000 in scholarships

The class of 1986 of Mother Seton Regional High School has been awarded over one-half million dollars in scholarship and awards. Three students, Kimberly Dukes, Lintin, Jeannette Hutton, of Newark, and Susan Rodriguez, of Clark were recognized as Garden State Distinguished Scholars. Distinguished Scholars represent less than three percent of New Jersey's Secondary School Seniors demonstrating the highest level of academic achievement based on their secondary school record. Scholastic Aptitude Test scores and nomination criteria established by the Department of Higher Education.
