**POLITICS OR BUSINESS?**

That was an interesting remark made to our representative by a prominent business man, to the effect that politics had ruled for twenty years in Rahway and the business men had been neglecting opportunities in the meantime.

Now there is nothing that interests the average man more than politics. Baseball and two or three other things can come pretty near it, but give him a chance to talk on politics and the average man will spend himself for a few minutes of solid enjoyment. This has been one of our national characteristics, at least if you can believe literature, ever since we have been a nation.

Nobody can complain about a healthy interest in politics. Taken at its best, it is the birthright of all our citizens and our government depends on it. In this country a man should be interested in politics, for he gets something out of the interest. In some countries the average citizen is reduced to a mere game of wondering curiosity at the political stage. He has no part in it and no expectation of ever having any part in it. But here any man may be anything from president down—and every man, therefore, has a close interest in what is going on. There are signs that to-day intelligent political opinion is a steadily increasing thing and force and is becoming bigger and better all the time. By virtue of this we are succeeding in being better governed to-day than we were twenty years ago. And we will have succeeded better twenty years hence.

But there is another kind of politics, and probably it is this kind of politics that our merchant refers to—petty politics. This is indulged in generally by a certain unchanging group of men who have nothing else to do particularly. It accomplishes nothing with any value for good and its only tangible result usually is to make men who are at heart very good fellows, enemies for life over some cause that in value does not compare favorably with a hill of beans.

This sort of politics obstructs men get involved in a maze of interminable quarrels and then every measure that comes up has its enemies, not because of its merits, but because some men have need themselves with it, and this automatically calls for others to be against it. And so the exponents of petty politics get themselves involved in their own kaleidoscopic claims and lose the perspective of what is good.

This kind of politics is not good for a city. It is a constant and very reactionary force against the "get together" idea. Hard-headed citizens are coming more and more

to realize that economic forces are at the root of government, national, state, county and town and that politics is but the hand-maid of economics. In other words, politics is the system by which we elect the men who are to do our public business for us. What is the principal thing, to get the electing done, or to get the business done?

The thing to do now is for the Rahway citizens to get together and boom the city. They have found that they could not do it—at least they have not—through the medium of indulging in politics. Let them now organize as a force of economy. Be energetic. Draw new business here, dwell on the advantages of Rahway, boom the land values, get public improvements through. Do all these things so energetically and effectively that there will be no time to think of petty politics. Then Rahway will get her due.
