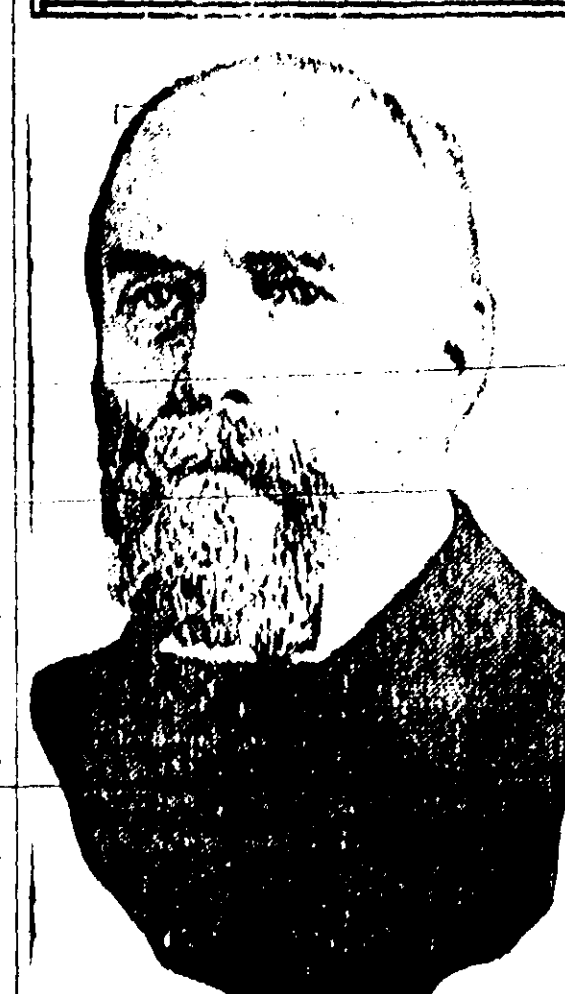
American Champion Retains World's Title.

AMERICAN BOAT WINS.

Defeat British Entries in International Cup.

State Board Changes Mind About Sewers

City Engineer Gets Word That Veto Has Been Taken Off Plans

Assessors' Figures of Values Filed Today

Total Valuation For City of \$6,729,633 Is Small Increase Over Last

Figures showing the total valuation of property in this city were filed with County Clerk Caldwell at Elizabeth by Nathan J. Compton, president of the Board of Assessors today. The sum of \$6,729,633 covers the total valuation. This is a slight increase over last year's figures.

Including in these figures are real estate, personal property and second class railroad property. The value of the real estate in this city is placed at \$5,077,076, personal property at \$1,000,000, and the balance in second class railroad property.

It is expected that the tax rate will remain practically stationary. If any increase is made it will be slight. The county's rate is expected to advance owing among other things to the need for additional expenditures under the "new" law. This law requires that the county shall pay for the maintenance of the roads.
