

Of course, the seven candidates receiving the highest votes will be the party candidates. The act does not provide for districts, the freeholders will be elected at large. . The new board of seven men are supposed to do the work that the twenty perform at the present time, and assuming that the seven freeholders must dvote all their time to coun-

ty business, can they do it for \$1,500 and pay all their expenses as the act provides ? This is a question asked by those in favor of retaining the present board. In Passaic and Middlesex counties, where they have adopted the act and have small boards the freeholders get their expenses and auto hire. As all the laws that sapply to the old board aapply to the nev board, they will have the same officers, so from a financial point of view. it is claimed, the new board is bound to be more expensive, and small municipalities wil have no representation if the majority of the board members are from Elizabeth.
