Recently the steel master expressed sympathy for Mrs. Sage and mentioned the problems with which she has been burdened.
"His sole aim in creating the Carnegie Corporation was to relieve Mrs. Carnegie of these responsibilities," said Colonel Church.

New York, Nov. 14.—The drivers of the street cleaning department who are out on strike have announced their willingness to resume work. But they will not be allowed to do so. Mayor Gaynor holds that the men have committed a notorious act and have cut themselves off from all further consideration by the city officials.
