"As for myself," he said, "I have a secret to tell you. I am in favor of woman's suffrage. Why? Because I know that the average woman is not only as well equipped with intelligence to cast her vote as the average man, but displays an honesty of purpose that is greater and is possessed of better qualities for keen perception and a willingness to trust women with the ballot."

Indianapolis Mayor Swamped by Fair Applicants.

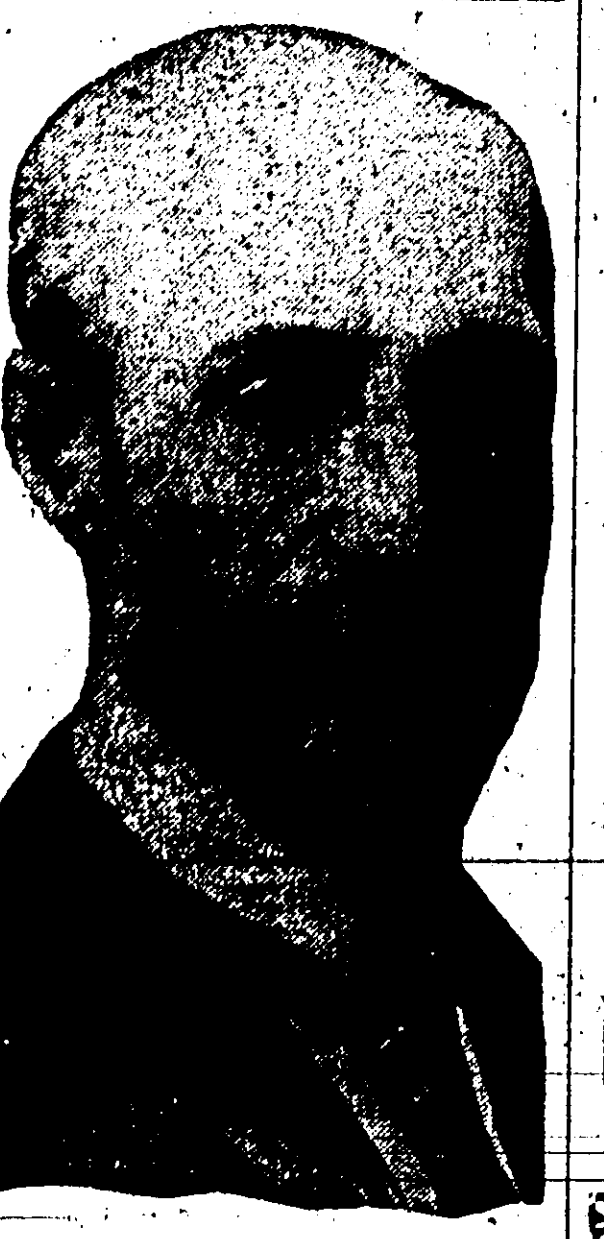

PRAISED BY MANY EXPERTS

Committee from Different Schools Say  
Machine is Entirely Original and  
Marvel at Its Success

Frank E. Boland, the Rahway aviator, has demonstrated to his own satisfaction and to that of a number of the foremost experts on aviation in the world, that he has constructed a new type of airplane which is distinctly an advance on any of its predecessors.

Mr. Boland's machine differs widely from any other in existence and its construction is in many ways entirely opposed to previously known theories of aerial navigation.

The new machine has been seen in flight and examined by a committee of experts, among whom were Ernest Laube Jones, an American authority, Dr. Paul P. Dana, the German expert, and Alexander McFee, a British expert.

Mr. Boland's machine is unusual in that it has some of the features of a biplane, but it is entirely different in its construction and in its operation.

It is understood that it is Mr. Boland's intention in the near future to bring his machine to this city and that he will organize a school of aviation here, thus introducing one more progressive industry to the community.
