The national banking laws require a national bank outside of the reserve cities (New York, Philadelphia, Chicago, St. Louis, etc.) to keep a reserve fund of at least 10 per cent of its deposits on hand at all times, of which at least 5 per cent must be kept in cash and 5 per cent may be kept on deposit with a national bank in a reserve city. 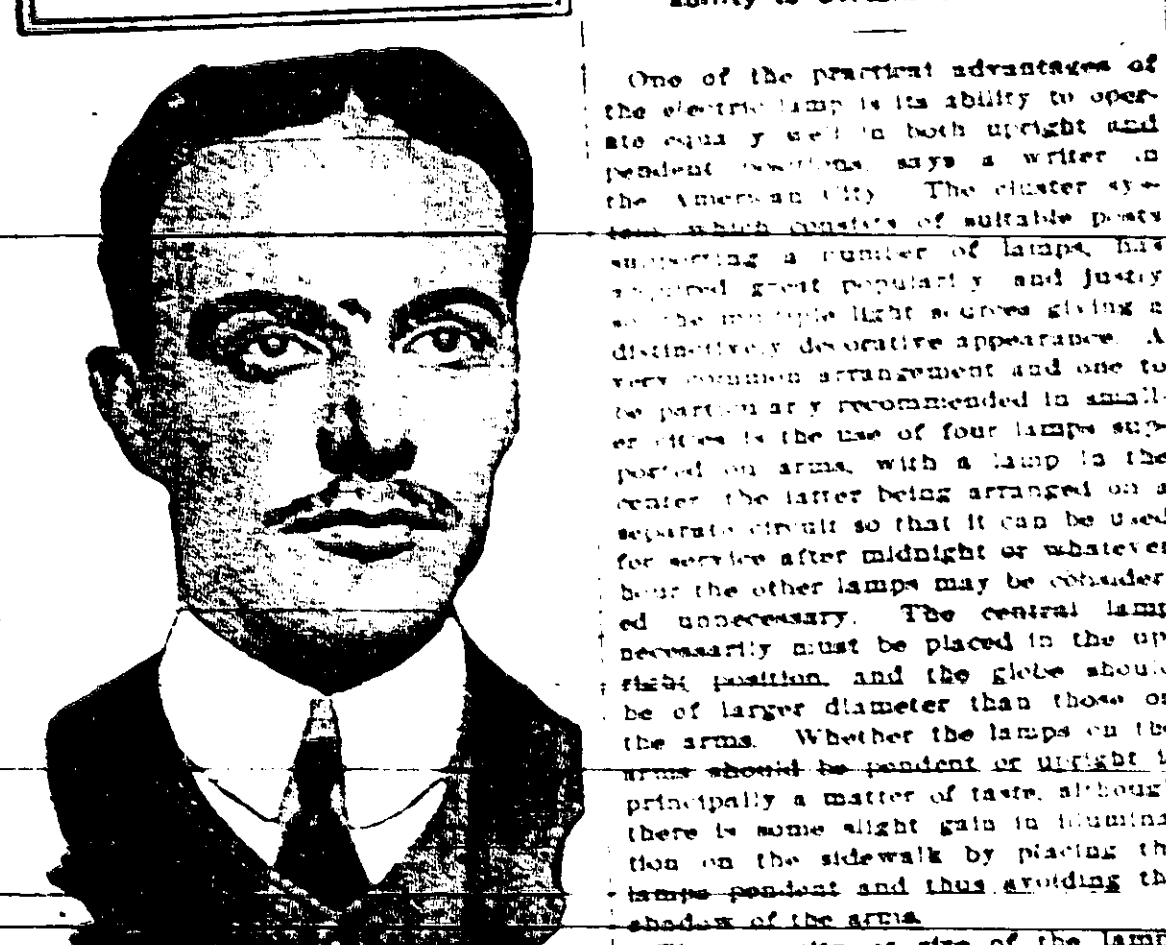
