The first thing that J. Bruce Ismay, managing director of the steamship company that owned the Titanic, said when he was taken on board the Carpathia from a lifeboat was: "For God's sake give me somethin to est."

Mr. Ismay declared that he was th last man who entered the last boat tha was taken away from the sinking Tita nic. He also apperted positively that there was no use of firearms.
