Godfrey Made Temporary Chairman of Commission.

HEARINGS OPEN TO PUBLIC

With Nine Original Appointees Present the New Commission to Investigate the Merits Canal Abandonment Proposition Met for Organization.

Trenton, N. J., May 8.—With nine of the original appointees present the new commission to investigate the merits canal abandonment proposition met for organization at the statehouse. Assemblyman Carlton Godfrey was made temporary chairman, and Assemblyman Samuel J. May was made temporary secretary. They were made permanent.

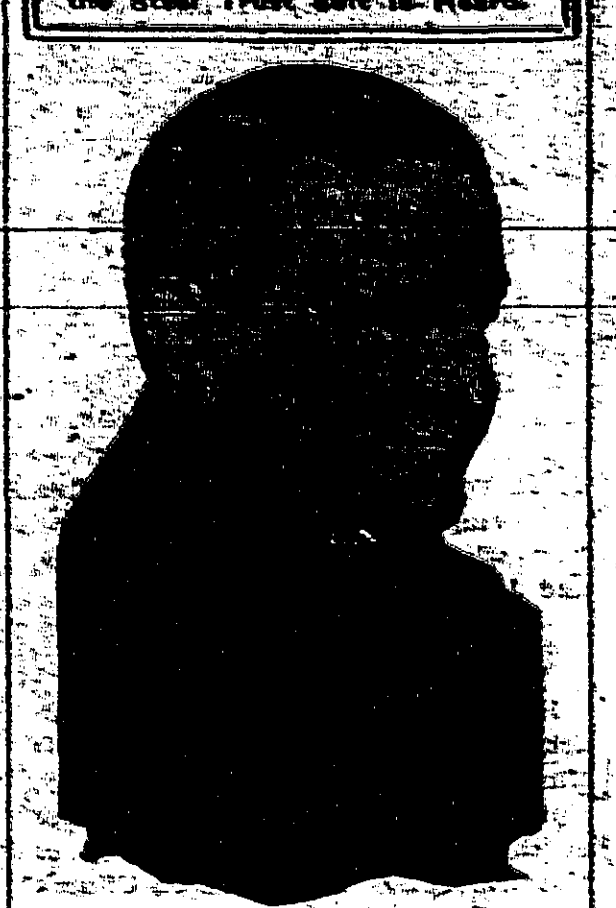
