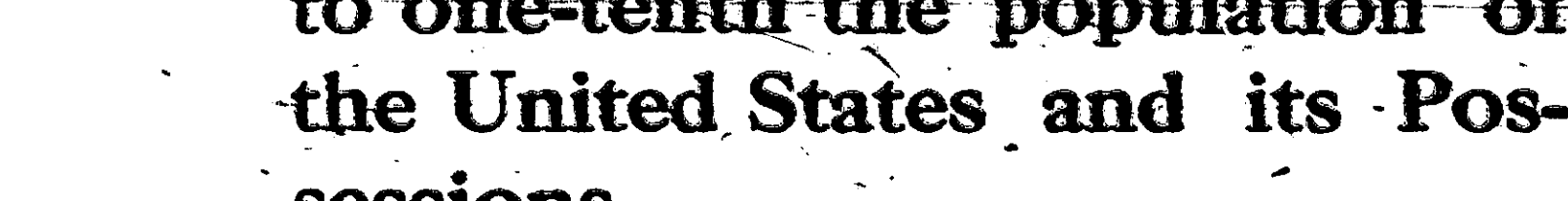
The past record of the choir's operettas has produced an early demand for tickets, so, for the information of the public, the Daily Record will publish the day when the sale of tickets will be opened.

LIBERATES MANY GAME BIRDS.

Game Warden Hoblitzel Distributes Many Game Birds.

Game Warden Hoblitzel has just liberated in excess in this vicinity 200 English pheasants, 45 Hungarian partridges and 186 quail. Today he received notice that 100 more pheasants would be shipped in the immediate future.

The state also will provide buckshot to be planted by farmers and others on their lands. This seed is intended to be left as food for the birds. Mr. Hoblitzel has taken care of ten bushels of buckshot and will distribute it in the near future.

The game warden calls special attention to the law on this. This fish may only be caught between May 30 and November 30, and no fish under nine inches in length may be retained. A severe penalty will be inflicted on anyone convicted of a breach of this law.

The open season on woodcock commences this year on October 15. Any person killing other game birds between that date and the opening of the season for other birds will be subject to a fine of \$100, one-half of which sum goes to the person through whom conviction is obtained.
