Elizabeth, March 7, 1887. Regular meeting of the Board held on Thursday, March 4, 1887, at 10 o'clock p. m. Present—Director of Schools and Freeholders (Lattin, Chapman, Doty, Dobbie, Dardis, Hubbard, Hilday, Howard, Isaacman, Oliver, Pitzer, Pizarra, Roll, Vanderhook, West, Wright, and Ziegler.)

On motion of Freeholder Doty, resolved and referred to county attorney, jail committee and legal committee.

By Director Martine: Resolved, That the bills of J. B. Jenkins and John D. Chapman, amounting to \$20.00, be paid when properly sworn to.

On motion of Freeholder Oliver, adopted by a unanimous vote: Resolved, That the committee on Milson Avenue drawbridge, Rahway, be empowered to renew the contract with Peter Van Pel, as draughtsman of said bridge, at the same compensation as paid last year, viz., \$250.

On motion of Freeholder Dobbie, adopted by a unanimous vote: Resolved, That the bill of Charles H. Schmidt, amounting to \$40, be paid when properly approved.
