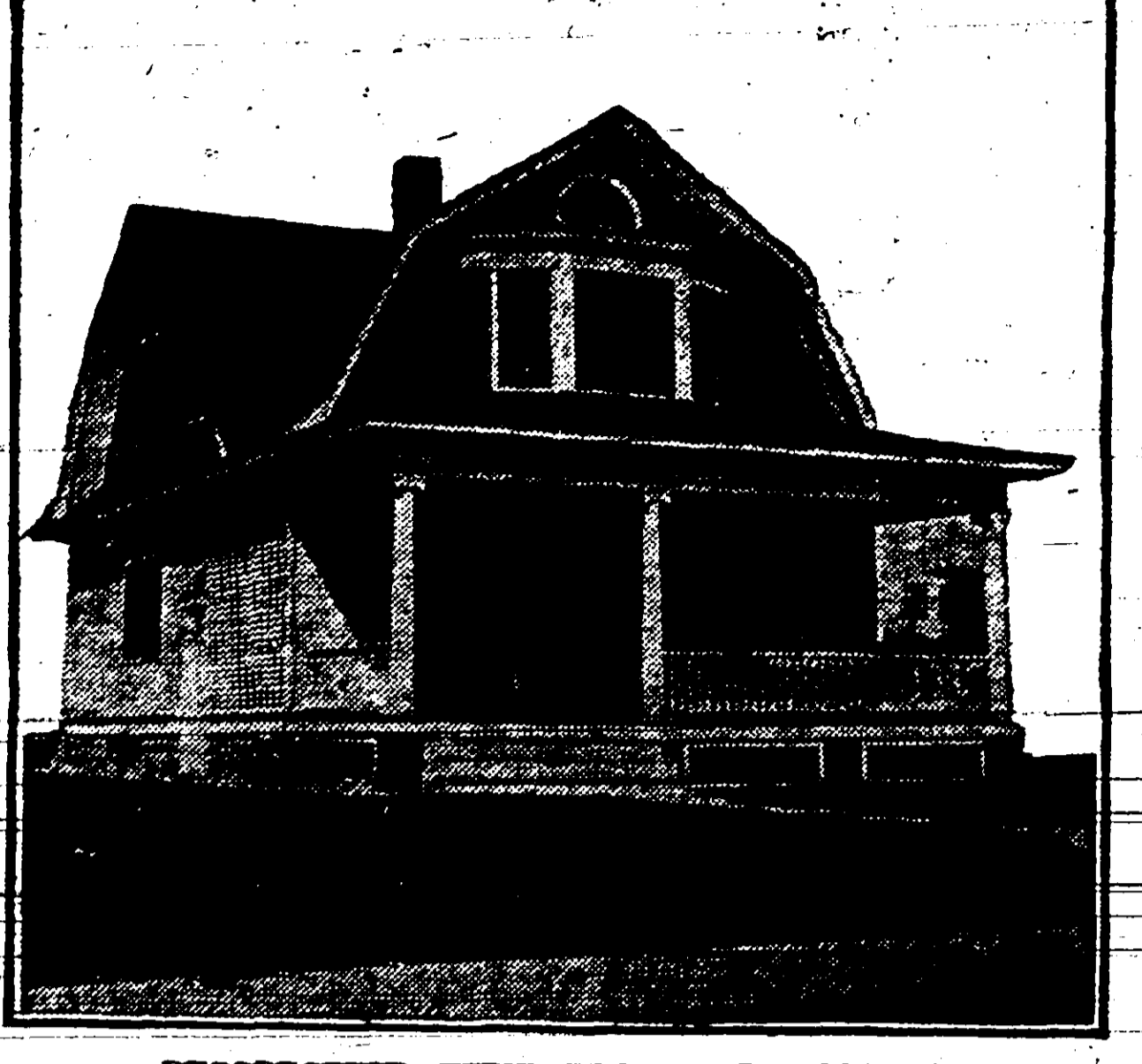

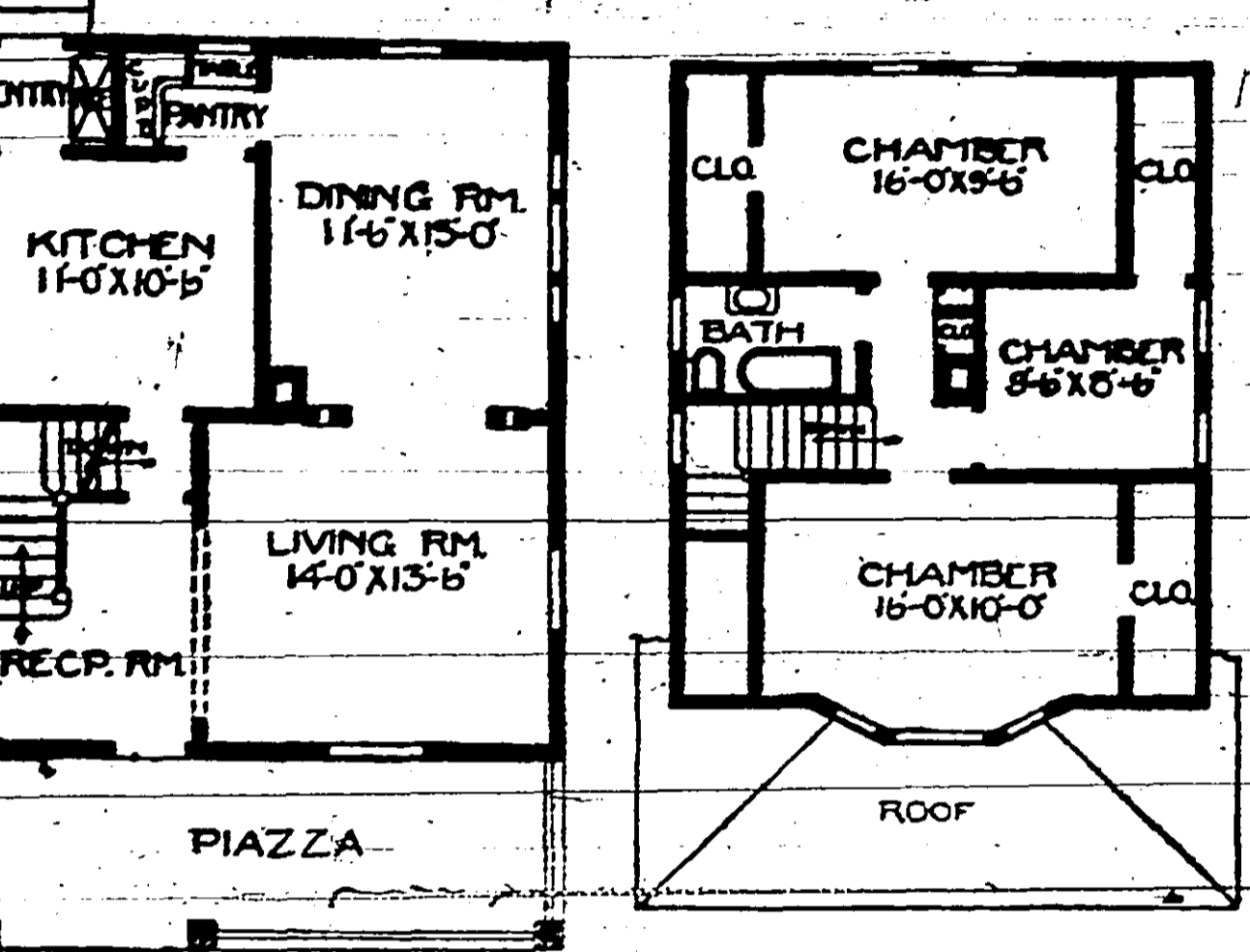

CAPTURING AN ATOM OF ELECTRICITY.

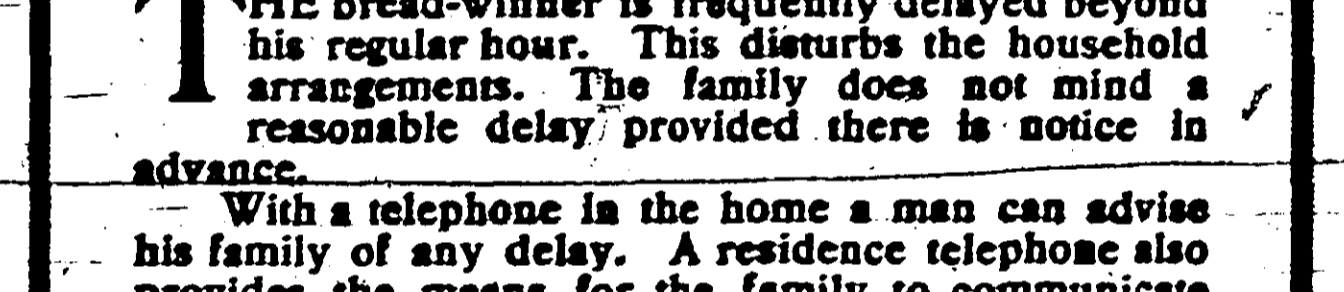
Chicago Professor Claims to Have Isolated a Single Ion of Electricity.

A single ion, the atom of electricity, has been isolated and studied, the utility of electrical charge has been accurately measured and the actual structure of the charge observed for the first time by Robert A. Millikan, assistant professor of physics at the University of Chicago.

Professor Millikan has swept away much of the mystery surrounding the nature of the electrical charge since the discovery of electricity. Besides capturing an individual ion, the long misunderstood carrier of electricity, he has viewed in his laboratory jumpy specks of electricity of charged bodies, disproving the theory that electricity is an "imponderable fluid" and upholding the "inductance" or "ionic hypothesis" of Faraday.

The actual catching of the single ions was accomplished by the introduction of a "droplet" of oil between the plates of a horizontal air condenser. The presence of the ions became apparent owing to the action of the oil particles.

AN ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE regulating the sale, storage and use of gunpowder, fireworks or fireworks of any description in the City of Rahway.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to manufacture, sell, offer for sale, loan or give away to any retail dealer, consumer or user, located in the City of Rahway, any blank or ball cartridge (shot), gun, cannon, blank cartridge, powder, or any explosive containing three (3) inches in length and one-half (1-2) an inch in diameter, firecracker of any size containing any explosive more powerful than black gun powder, torpedo exceeding one-half (1-2) an inch in diameter, or any substance containing chlorate of potash and sulphur or containing picric acid or picrates or any instrument or device for discharging or exploding such.

The court had the pleasure of hearing some good speeches. The orphan's home, how families are kept together by keeping children at home instead of sending them to the orphan's home; also about the tuberculosis hospital, opened July 1, 1910, at Rainbow Lake, in the Adirondacks, New York. There is a membership of nearly 270,000 and over \$14,000,000 surplus.

Section 2. No person shall place or cause to be placed under the wheels of any vehicle or car, caps or other explosives of any kind or character without the consent of the person or persons owning or controlling said vehicle or car.

Section 3. From and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person at any time to discharge or set off anywhere within the City of Rahway or in his possession for such purpose any blank or cartridge pistol, cannon, blank cartridge, firecracker exceeding three (3) inches in length and one-half (1-2) an inch in diameter, or any explosive more powerful than black gun powder, torpedo exceeding one-half (1-2) an inch in diameter, or any substance containing chlorate of potash and sulphur, or containing picric acid or picrates, or any instrument or device for discharging or exploding such, or any Roman candle or fire-balloons.

Section 4. No fireworks shall be displayed or sold from any stand outside the walls of any building.

Section 5. No fireworks of any description shall be kept in stock for the purpose of being sold at retail prior to the first day of June, nor later than the fifth day of July in any year.

Section 6. Any person, firm or corporation violating section one of this ordinance shall forfeit and pay a penalty of ten (\$10) dollars for each offense, and any person violating any provision of this ordinance, except section one, shall forfeit and pay a penalty of five (\$5) dollars for each offense.

Section 7. That nothing in the foregoing ordinance shall be translated to apply to local dealers having showrooms or retail stores for the purpose of selling or displaying such fireworks for sale and use during what is generally known as "the gunning season," nor shall this ordinance apply to the use of dynamite or other explosives used exclusively for commercial purposes.

Section 8. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
