The Flax Plant. Linen is obtained from the flax plant, a small delicate annual with a stay like flower. The plant is pulled by hand in the summer, the seeds, known as burrs, are cleaned, being removed and the straw subjected to various processes to separate the fibrous part which constitutes the linen. First it is steeped in water and then passed through a drying and beating process on mangle rollers until all foreign matter is removed. It is then ready for manufacture.
