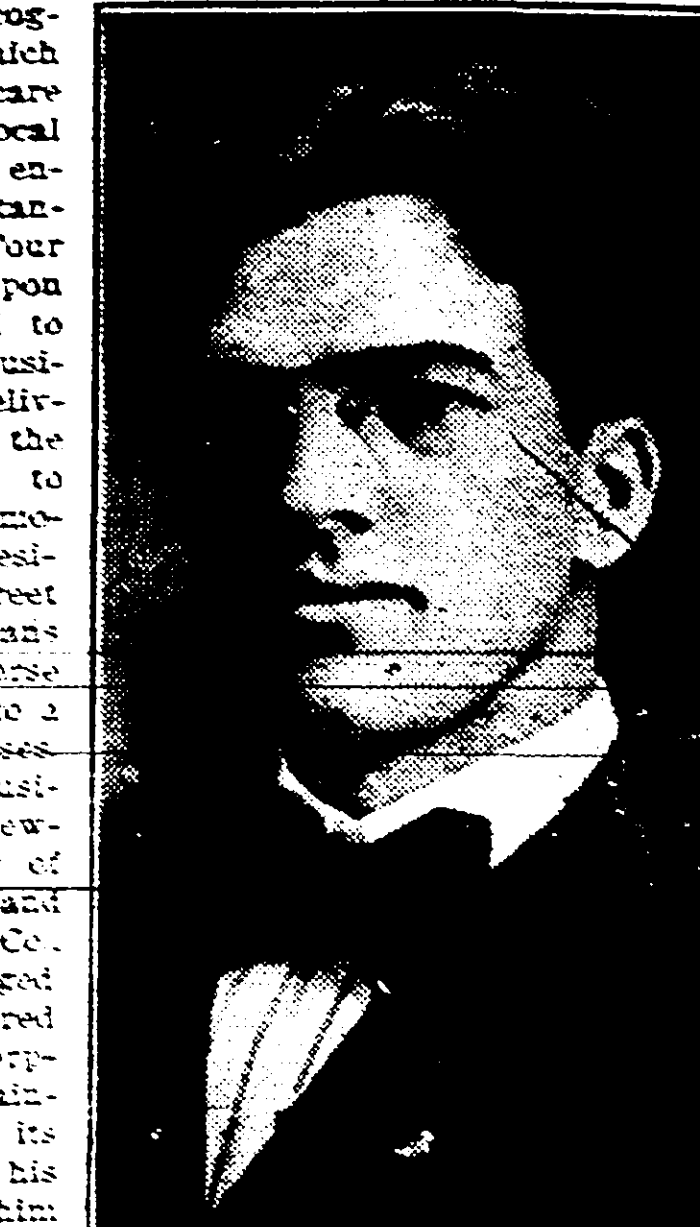

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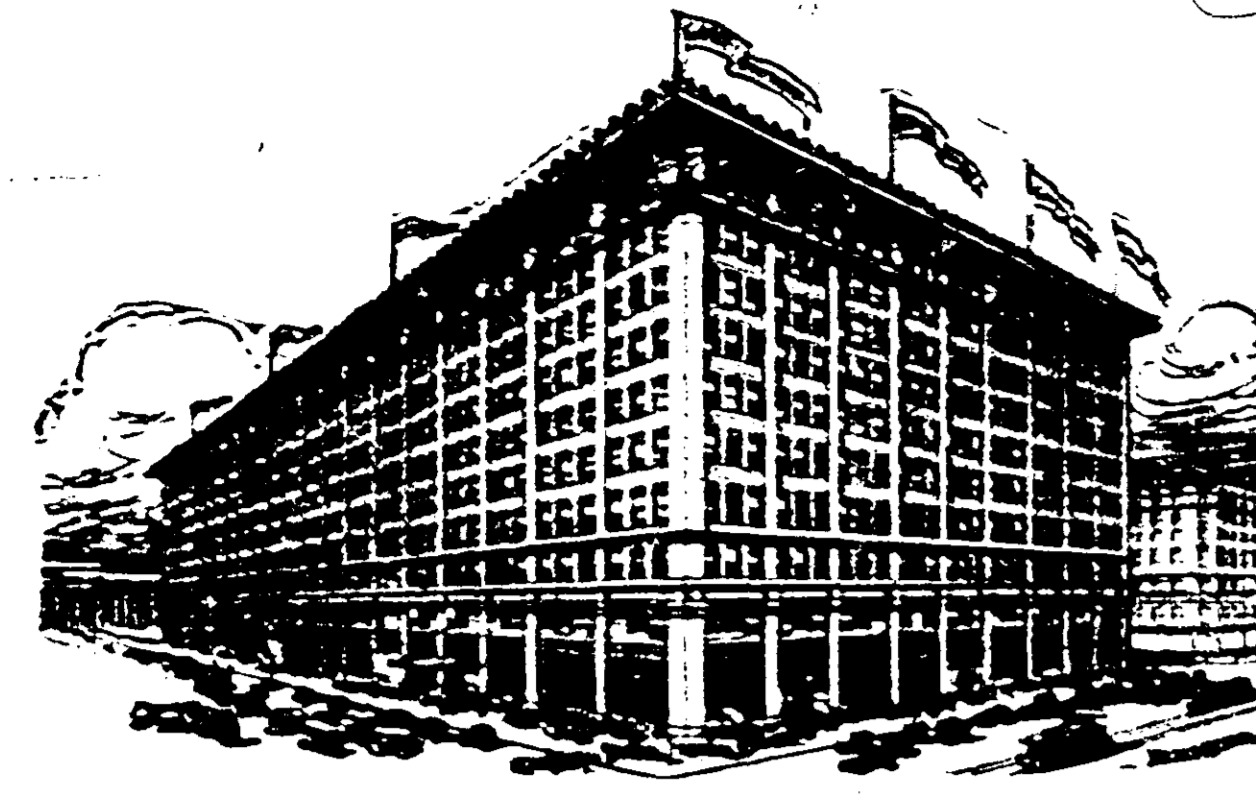

An amendment to section 23 of the city ordinances, relating to the muzzling and licensing of dogs, was offered by Councilman Bartlett and passed on first reading. The bill gave amended provision for the muzzling of dogs between May 1st and October 1st.

There were but two bids submitted for the work of placing the Alameda in a more sanitary condition. Thomas A. Roark bid \$500, and Tombs & Roark bid \$500.

A resolution by Councilman Valentin that as the tax rate of this year, being 1.50, would create \$600,38 in excess of the necessary amounts estimated for city expenses, the sum be appropriated to the sinking fund, was adopted unanimously.

A motion by Councilman Bartlett that the City Clerk be authorized to request the Circuit Court to appoint a Commissioner of Assessment on the Westside Avenue sewer, recently completed, was adopted.
