Editor of the Advocate: Since it has been announced that the tax rate for 1910 is 1.96 as compared with the rate of 1.84 for 1909, I have been asked by interested tax payers what has caused the increase of 12 points, and in answering these inquiries have prepared the following table of the tax budgets of 1910 and 1909.

Any one who will take the trouble to make the comparison can readily see that of the increase of \$20,987.81 over the budget of 1909, the council was COMPELLED to appropriate \$17,694.60.



"Which was read and on motion of Mr. Lewis was laid on the table." And thus Lewis killed labor's anti-It would seem that Mr. Fallon made a futile effort to get favorable action on his bill. His resolution to take the bill out of the hands of the committee indicates that he realized that the committee was hostile to the measure and that unless he took some action his bill would be buried in the committee.
