NOW THE DOGS ARE TO STAY MUZZLED

Five Councilmen Attempt to Pass Ordinance Over Mayor's Veto.

Also Authorize Purchase of Fire Steamer, When No Funds Are Available.

MAYOR SUPPORTED BY HEALTH BOARD

Approved His Veto of the Now Famous Dog Ordinance

Dairy Reports Were Submitted and Commended by the Board.

Anxiety to Railroad Important Matter Makes Councilmen Look Foolish—Most Any Schoolboy Could Give Them Points on Parliamentary Halling.

Six members of Common Council have established a record for transacting business in recent times. The same six members have also established a reputation for ignorance in matters pertaining to parliamentary rulings.

The results of the efforts of those who are opposed to compulsory vaccination in securing signatures to the petitions asking for the reinstatement of the pupils who have been expelled were even more gratifying than expected.

There are many pupils in the schools who have been expelled under false certificates or without certificates at all. Those who are still out could be admitted under like conditions, if the parents were willing to do so.

It has been admitted by individual members of the Board, and it is generally understood throughout the city, that the action of the Board on this matter has been largely a result of spite work for a purpose.

It is hoped that the Board of Education will recognize the petition of 864 parents, which could be augmented by hundreds or thousands more if time permitted, and make the reasonable concession asked for in the petition.

The Board of Health, with its supporters in the Common Council, might well sit up and shiver at the thought of the conditions in the matter of the dog ordinance and the perpetual danger which follows the unrestricted running at large of canines through our city streets.

It was in anticipation of just the conditions which now confront us that the Board of Health secured the passage of an ordinance compelling all dogs to be muzzled during the fire year, and it is fair to say that were it not for the enforcement of this ordinance we would have suffered most seriously from the much threatened rabies. Even under the restrictions of the ordinance, two dogs were killed last week, the head of which was sent to New York, the condition showing a decided case of rabies.

The Board of Health, at its regular meeting last week, with all members present except Commissioner Hiltner, supported unanimously the ordinance taken by Mayor Howard in vetoing the New York fur ordinance, which would have permitted dogs to run at large from October 1 to May unmuzzled. The Board was strengthened in its purpose in this matter by the fact that within a few days since the Mayor's veto, a Rahway dog had been pronounced as having rabies, the head having been sent to the Pasteur Institute in New York for examination. Another dog was killed, and it is being carefully watched in the meantime for signs of hydrophobia.

A communication was received from Gen. M. McGuire, chief of the Division of Hygiene and Diseases of the State Board of Health, advising that he was enclosing copies of eleven reports, embracing the reports of the Inspector of Rahway, dated October 29 to 31, 1910, showing that three of these scores range from 25 to 25.50 per cent., eight from 20 to 25 per cent. I congratulate you on this showing. It is something we do not often meet on the first inspection. Letters have been written to those dairymen whose scores show defects which are considered detrimental to the milk supply, urging them to remove all such defects themselves as a nuisance to the neighbors.

There is no reason why flower beds and lawns should be made the playground of neighbors' pets, much to the disgust and annoyance of those who have no animals to send out to destroy their neighbors' property in this way.

Estimated Decease, Make \$2000 Yearly Out of the Practice of Vaccinations. Counting the original charges for the operation and the later charges for attendance upon the victims, it is conservatively estimated that the doctors of Rahway reap a harvest of over \$2000 per year by the practice of vaccination. It is to be wondered at that they insist upon a continuation of this vile means of earning a living.
