REFORMATORY WORK TOLD OF.

(Continued from page 1)

They now start, it is emphasized, that the one who is granted to be reformed, and that no matter what a young man's record may or may not have been in the institution, he must give, by his reliability, his faithfulness to honor his parole and general uprightness of spirit, reasonable evidence that he is really reformed. Altogether these rules have been a great success.

"Discipline has been improved and yet corporal punishment has not been resorted to during the entire year. Harder and better work has been done, greater improvement has also been made in the studies of the school and the average time spent by the young men in the institution has been considerably shortened. The average time required for reaching parole for the last three years has been as follows: 1908, 18 months and 20 days; 1909, 17 months and seven days; 1910, 16 months and 23 days.

"Thus, the new system, while making more exacting requirements of the inmates, has, nevertheless, enabled him to struggle harder, and the average time of detention has been reduced nearly two months. In other words the 306 inmates paroled during the year have each reached parole in fifty-seven days less than under the former rule, thus giving them the liberty that much sooner and saving the State the cost of their maintenance for that period of time. Reduced to years this has been a total saving of 44 years for one man, which is fully equal to one man's efficient lifetime.

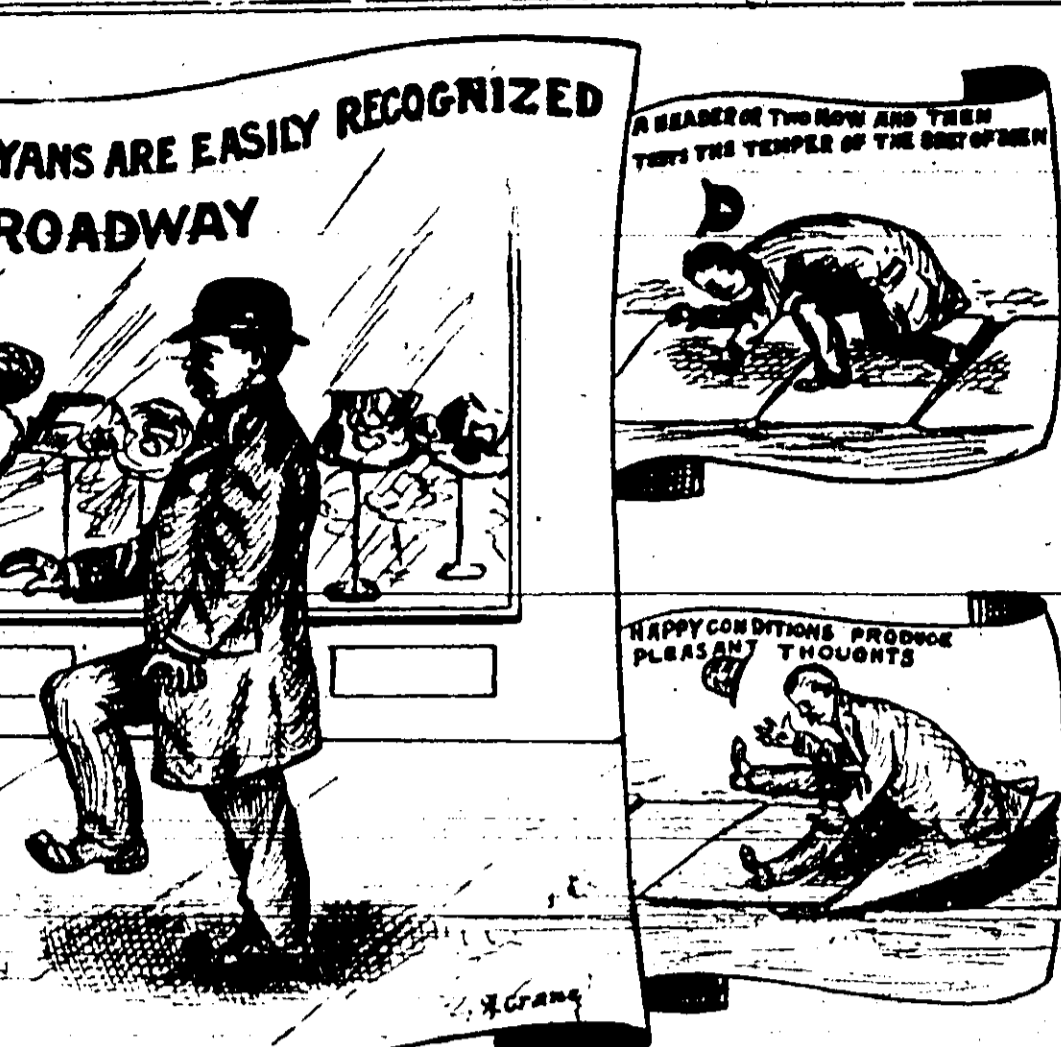
"In the government of the institution the principle we have tried to keep uppermost has been 'doing unto the young man in the reformatory as we would like to have him do unto us under the same circumstances.' We have believed that young men could be best fitted for success in the world at large not by making the reformatory a place of abnormal life, but by making it as nearly like the real world as we could, and still retain the ideas of firm discipline, faithful industry, careful study and pure type of religious instruction.

"Realizing that much of crime is because of indolence and ignorance, we have laid the strongest emphasis we possibly could upon industry and the pursuit of knowledge. In these two things our requirements have been most rigid, but while this has been true, we have also felt that a wholesome life required a certain amount of recreation for its true development.

"A monthly moving picture entertainment has been established to which every young man who has made a good record for one month is given a 'ticket.' This has proven not only an hour's recreation, which has been an aid to the young man who is trying to do his best, but it has also been a help in maintaining good discipline. Baseball has been allowed three times a week all through the summer and on many Saturdays matched games have been played with teams from adjoining towns.

"Personal habits have also been considered an important part of reform; therefore young men who have scarcely known anything else but slippers have been furnished them for their rooms. A lightweight khaki suit as a summer uniform has this year replaced the woolen suit that was formerly worn the whole year around.

"The matter of health has been greatly improved by the adoption of a special drill conducted out of doors every day at noon. The schedule of the institution for the last three months was less than 50 per cent of what it was a year ago. We believe that the physical treatment is



distinct of honor. During the year 249 inmates have worked at different times outside of the buildings and their enclosures. These have often been under very slight guard, sometimes being fully a mile away from the institution. At other times they have, where necessary required, worked through the night alone, and yet there have been only three attempts at escape, or loss of their parole, out of those working outside. In two cases where young men had lost their fathers by death they were allowed to leave the institution entirely on their honor to go to their homes, being there over night, attending the funeral and returning the next day in each case exactly at the appointed time.

"A club known as the R. T. C., or 'Right Thinkers' Club, has been organized, and has proved a marked success. At first it consisted of 20 members, who expressed a desire to join a club of their own. It has since increased to 100 members, and many others have been paroled who said as they left that the R. T. C. stood for 'real, true citizenship.'

"During the year we have made a careful study of the mental development of the young offender who has entered the institution. By the aid of a scientific psychological system developed by Dr. Hinet of France, we have been able to classify each inmate according to his mental instead of natural age. This examination of the mental ability of the young man sent to the reformatory is fundamental in intelligently determining where he may best be placed and how he can best be treated in order to accomplish his reformation. It is as essential as a careful diagnosis by a wise physician. A young man, for example, entered the institution during the year who was nineteen years of age, but on examination he was found to possess the brain of a child only five years of age. To restate of him that which is

required of a normal would be neither just nor successful. "Outside of the institution we have also been carrying out with much trouble and pains, a study of associations, habits, environments and heredity, not only as a means of crime, but as an aid in arriving at the best method of treating the young man while in the reformatory, as well as the worst disposition to make of him when placed on parole."

"The report says that the department in charge of parole has discovered that the inmates who have been overcharging the public for years and will continue to do so unless their monopoly is broken up; thus their prices and charges will come down.

Home Course in Health Culture

VIII.—Exercise in the Home

By EUGENE L. FISKE, M. D.

FOR centuries the alchemists sought an elixir—a magic fluid that would restore exhausted vitality and perpetuate the active life. For many years physicians and chemists, successors of the "medicine man" and alchemist, have laboriously experimented with drugs and chemicals in the hope of some finding some combination that would give health and increased longevity to mankind. Many valuable drugs and combinations of drugs have been discovered—but it is safe to say that the greatest achievements of medical science have come not through the employment of natural remedies which were so long neglected by the "medicine men" of the middle ages. It is true that alchemists and other remedies of a similar class are the "medicine men" of the modern age. They have no relation with drug treatment. The remarkable fall in the death rate among people under thirty years of age in this past quarter century is almost wholly due to hygiene and the use of natural remedies in disease. The power of physical training, fresh air and a little strategy to meet over the lymphatic, half deformed, and useful citizen is a wonderful way as the powers vainly sought for the cure of the death rate.

Exercise should be graded according to the individual. There are three types of exercise: 1. Aerobic, which is the most common and is the basis of all physical training. 2. Anaerobic, which is the most strenuous and is the basis of all athletic sports. 3. Mixed, which is a combination of the two and is the basis of all modern physical culture. The following is a brief outline of the several exercises:

First.—Aerobic. Standing with feet together and hands raised before the feet, as in a prayer, throw the hands and forearms backward and the arms are on a level with the shoulders and forearm directed straight out right angle with arms. Repeat ten to twenty times.

Second.—Two striding. Stand with feet together and arms thrust straight upward, but not rigid. Swing the upper part of the body from side to side. Third.—Striking an oval. Stand with feet together and arms thrust straight upward, but not rigid. Swing the upper part of the body from side to side.

Fourth.—Swimming. Stand with feet together and arms thrust straight upward, but not rigid. Swing the upper part of the body from side to side. Fifth.—Boxer's guard. Stand with feet together and arms thrust straight upward, but not rigid. Swing the upper part of the body from side to side.

AN ORDINANCE. WHEREAS THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THE CITY OF RAHWAY, NEW JERSEY, BEING ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMONS COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RAHWAY: Section 1. That in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter 61 of the Laws of one thousand nine hundred and ten, entitled "An act to provide for the assessment and collection of taxes in third class cities of this State," there shall be established in the City of Rahway a Board of Tax Assessors...

shall hold office until the expiration of the calendar year in which he shall be chosen, and thereafter shall hold office until the expiration of the calendar year next after that in which he shall have been elected; and the third shall hold office until the expiration of the second calendar year in which he shall have been chosen; and then successors shall be elected and shall hold office for the full term of three years; but such officers, including those first elected, shall continue in office until their successors are chosen and qualified. Any such officer may be removed from office in the manner now or hereafter to be provided by law; and in case of the death, resignation or removal of any such officer, his successor shall be chosen for the unexpired term only.

Section 2. Said Board of Assessors shall be composed of three members who shall be elected by the Common Council of the City of Rahway, and shall maintain an office at such place and keep the same open during such hours as the Common Council shall from time to time designate. The said board shall annually, during the month of January, elect one of their members as Clerk of said Board, who shall attend at the office of the said Board when required by the Common Council, and to whom all complaints regarding assessments shall be made in writing. It shall be the duty of said Clerk, upon receiving any such complaint, to bring the same forthwith to the attention of said Board, and it is the judgment of said Board, such complaint should be referred to the Common Council, it shall be the duty of said Clerk to immediately transmit the same in writing to the chairman of the Assessment Committee of Common Council, who shall bring the same to the attention of the Common Council.

### Babe Drowns; Mother Burned

In doing this the woman was severely burned on the face and hands. The child was frightfully burned on the face and body and had inhaled the flames. She was hurried to the City Hospital, where she died.

After his body had been cremated, Miss Evelyn says, she procured a small quantity of his ashes, which she had placed in the setting of the ring, behind a transparent film.

### Three Streak Amid Dancers

A dead drunk was thrown into Billerica Centre, Mass., town hall at a dance "Thanksgiving" night, breaking up the House School party and making it necessary to destroy the clothing of several of the girl students. Raymond Champagne, sixteen, was charged in court Saturday with malicious mischief in connection with the disturbance. Raymond denied the malicious intent and said he only wanted to see the amount jump about New Year's. He paid a \$25 fine.

### Lay Dead in Lepet's Home

The body of Thomas E. Allen, 71 years old, was found Saturday at his home in Marlboro, along the Bridge Street. The body was found in a room of the bungalow, where it had probably lain since Tuesday of last week. Allen was well to do, was married and had a married son, but preferred the life of a hermit and lived alone.
