DOCTORS SHOULD CLEAN HOUSE

"Medical Clean and Crime" is the title of a book in which the author, Dr. Thomas Barnsey, attempts to inquire into what he terms "the widespread demoralization in the medical profession." The indictment against him is clearly on the narrow ground of the medical ethics brought by the Carnegie Foundation for the advancement of teaching, and he is bound to attract more than ordinary attention.

The standard of "professional ethics" which is being aimed at the gross incompetence of a fellow practitioner even though maintaining and death have been caused by the latter's efforts to treat or operate on patients, is deemed to be "incapacitated" with any degree of social responsibility or of moral responsibility. Killing a patient is held to be a "crime" of the medical world that is "beyond the pale of ethics."

The book is a most interesting and one of the best of its kind. It is written by a man who is a member of the medical profession and who is respected in the community.
