BANK FUND GUARANTER PLAN FOR WISCONSIN.

MADISON, WIL, Fob. 64-A providing for the guarantee of bank deposits was introduced in the upper house of the legislature yesterday by Semator Owen. The bill has been the majority members of the legisla-

It provides that on the second Monday of next January all the state hanks shall set aside an amount equal to one per cent, of their average daily deposits for a fund to be known "Depositors'-Insurance Fund." Every year thereafter they will be required to add to this fund one-tenth of one per cent, of the average deposits until the total fund equals two per cent., of the average total depos-

hanks. who have not received nore than three per cent, interest on aposits are to be paid out of this infund, which is to be under the control of the state commissioner

Alt is expected that the guarantee the first one per cent, deposits have when the full two per cent, is paid.
