



GRAND RAPIDS' PROPOSED

The new Grand Rapids charter, as described by Robert W. Irwin, president of the charter commission, at a meeting of representatives of ten Michigan cities who recently met at Lansing to discuss charter reform and commission government, attracted much favorable comment. A comptroller will o e elected, who will be responsible or seeing that no fund is overdrawn.
