Rahway's Handsome New High School Building

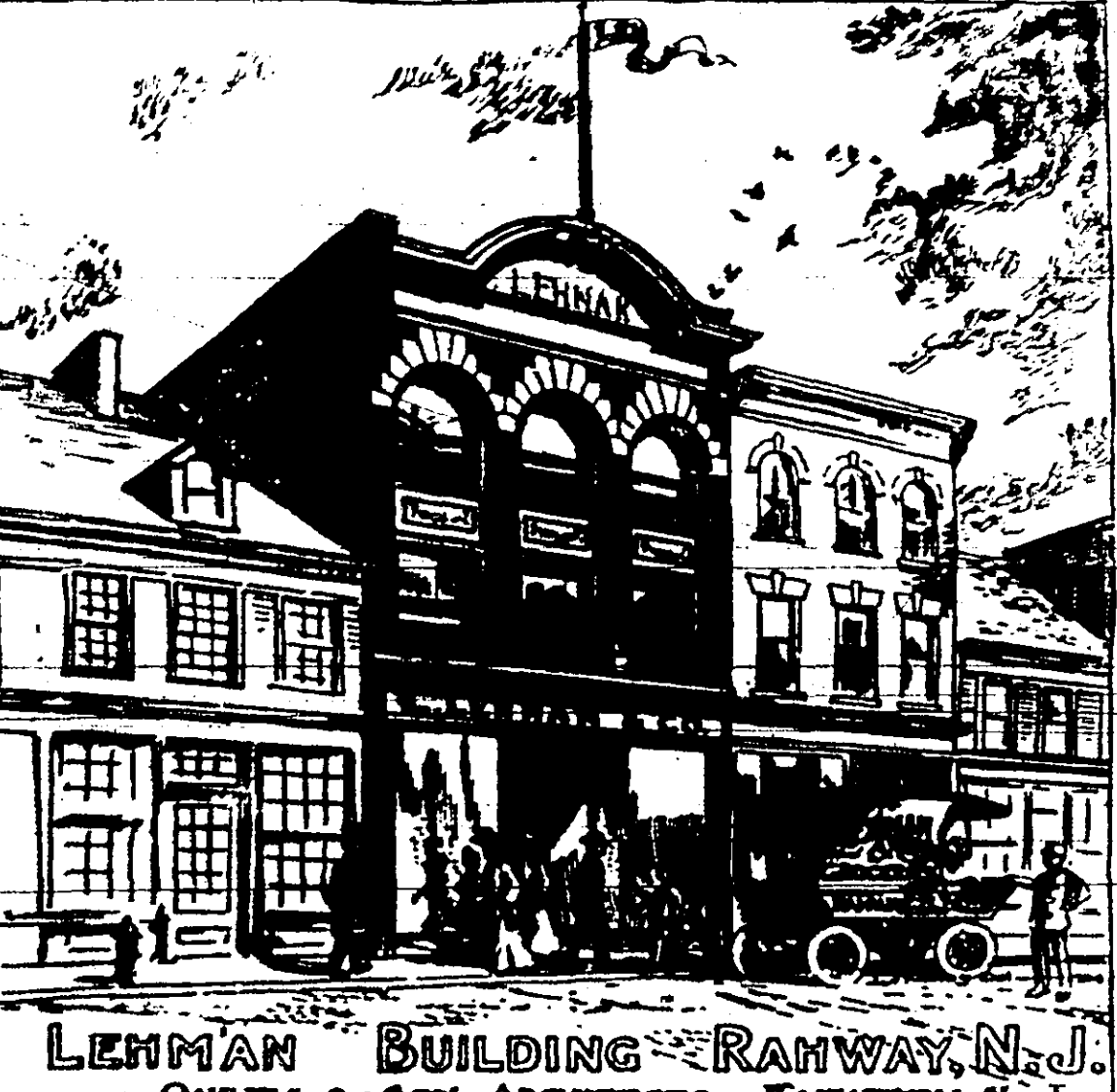

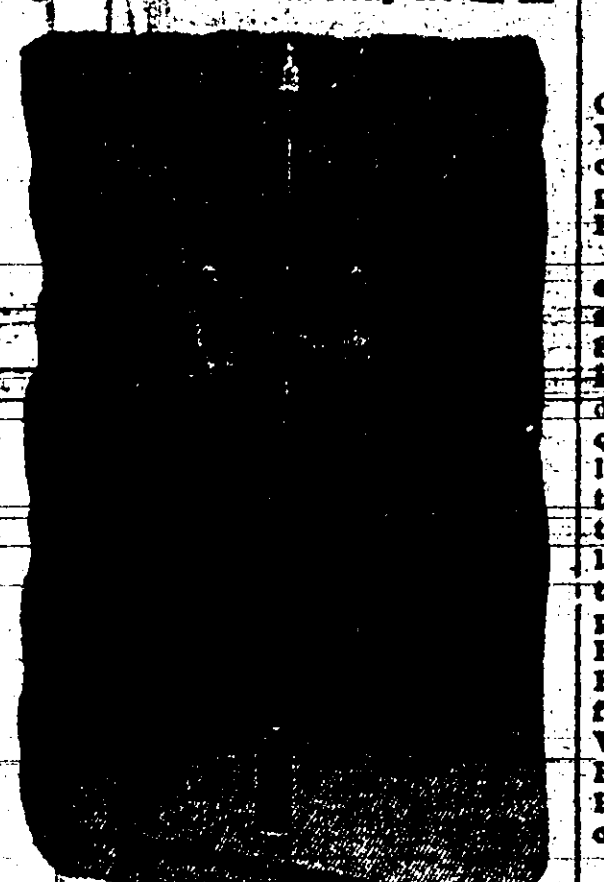

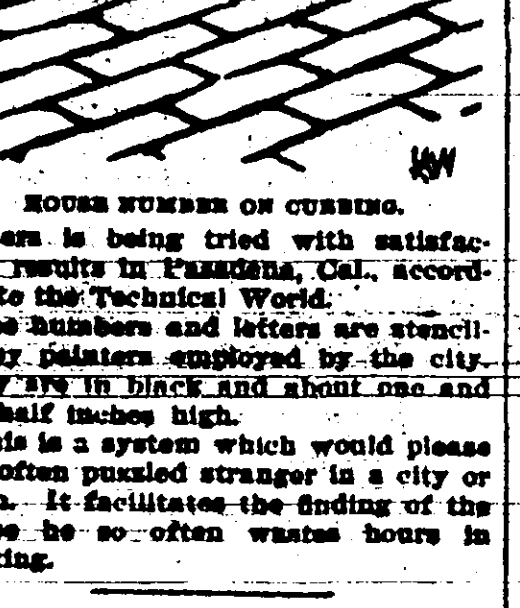

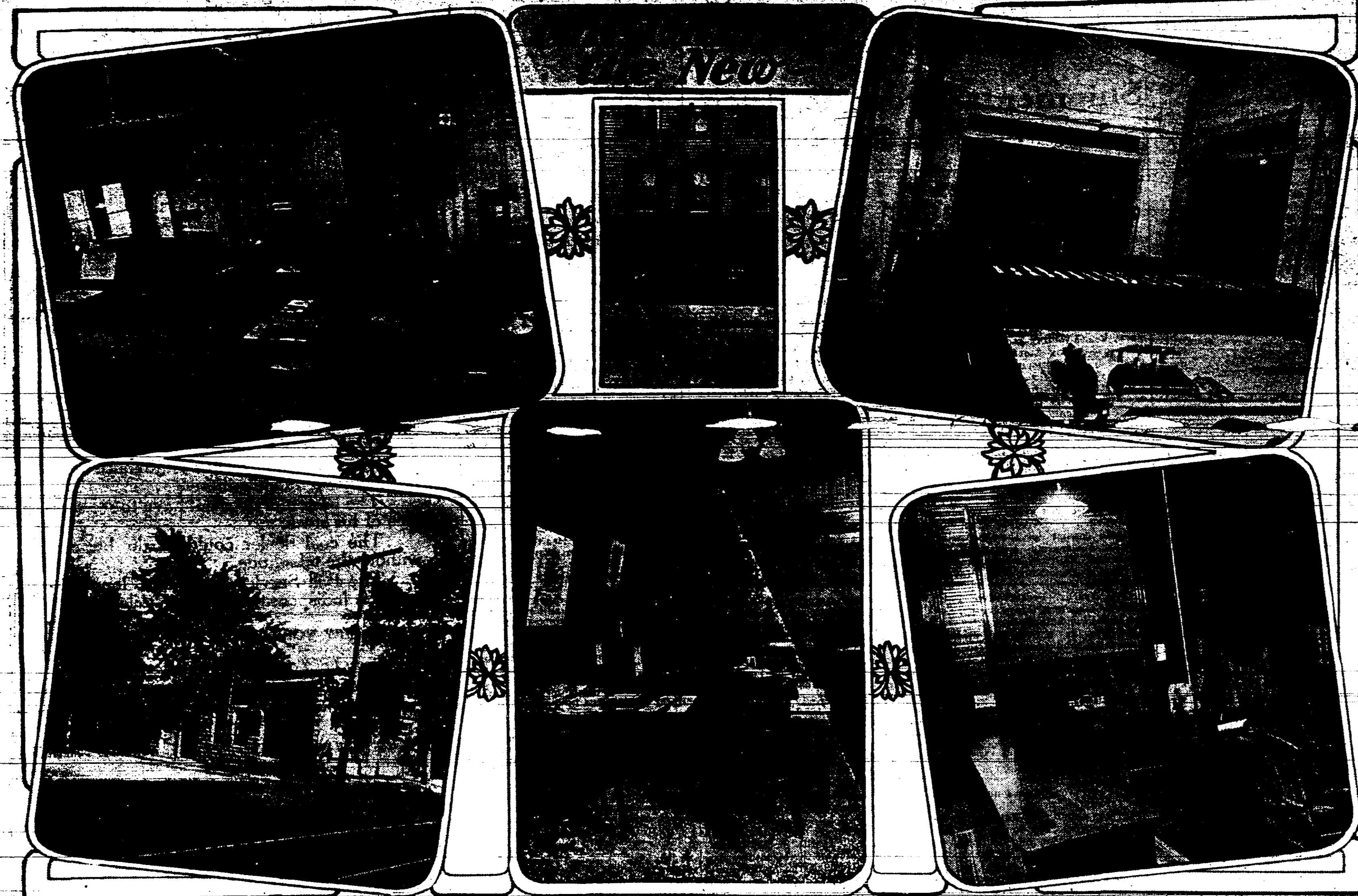

THE RAHWAY POSTOFFICE

H. B. ROLLINSON Postmaster
The success of Postmaster Rollinson in securing the appointment of another regular carrier has enabled him to give an improved service to all parts of the city. The last appointment of an additional carrier was in 1908, although an auxiliary allowance, sufficient to provide about four carriers per day has been in force for two or three years. The steady increase in the business of the office has made it difficult to maintain such a service as the postmaster desired to give the people of Rahway. The receipts of the postoffice have shown an average annual increase for several years past of from 15 to 20 per cent. For the year ending June 30, 1910, when the last carrier was appointed they were \$11,764.80. For the fiscal year ending June 30, this year, they will total about \$28,000. The money order and registry business have also grown greater. For the year ending June 30, 1910, 9,811 money orders were issued and \$208,345.10 in total. The registered mail matter received and despatched for the same period reached a total of 7,284, including the two rural routes. The postmaster some time ago visited Washington and presented the conditions here to the department officials and asked for the appointment of an additional carrier. The matter was referred to Postoffice Inspector Devereux and James L. Bodwell, who have been a substitute for two and a half years was recommended and on December 26, began his duties as a regular carrier. The work in the mailing department has also grown rapidly in the past year or two, especially in the amount of mail distributed by the Express Company, registered in the Old Building, March 4,
