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CARLISLE AND HIS LAMPS STILL BRING UP THE OLD AND OTHER OPINIONS

A man who studies statistics says that he can prove that there are more candles used today than ever before. That there are more old oil lamps burning every night in the year now than ever before in the history of the world.

Knowing the recent developments in electric lighting it is hard to believe this, but figures are figures, and they do say that it is quite impossible for figures to tell a whopper. Within the past few years electric light has been wonderfully improved in quality until it rivals the very sunbeams and has resulted, naturally, in a world-wide extension of artificial lighting.

City after city has started movements toward ornamental street lighting using the new lamps and cheap electrical energy. Thousands add thousands of homes have been wired for the new light and in spite of all this the eminent statistician comes forward with the statement that more smelly candles and dangerous oil lamps are used than ever before. Let him produce his proof!

Oil lamps, he tells us, are just displacing the old candles in the great Chinese empire. Millions and millions of these oil lamps are burning in the country when the electric light became general, are illuminating the houses of the poor, and are burning in the land of the poppy. Of course there are a great many kerosene lamps used in the country and districts where electricity is not yet available, but it is in China, where the great oil wells have been tapped, that the kerosene lamps are being most extensively used.

It is a rare sight in this country nowadays to see a person going about with a candle in his hand. But you must remember that there are plenty of people still alive, and not to very old either, who can well remember when the tallow candle was the only light in the house.

WHAT A FARMER CAN DO WITH ELECTRICITY

The farmer is just awakening to the importance of power in connection with his farm. He has learned that electricity is the most powerful force he can have practically demonstrated. It is being used for lighting, heating, irrigation, with safety and economy, to any point where needed and applied in any quantity desired. This electricity is generated from water, steam or gas, and is always located in one place and the current is transmitted over insulated wires to the mill room of the farm and from there to any part of the farm and farm buildings to do the work or to dispel the darkness.

Among the power machines which can be purchased for a nominal sum in these days of labor-saving devices are the following:
Food cutters, root cutters, fodder cutters, faning mills, griddles, circular saws, corn shellers, drill presses, cutluge cutters and elevators, horse clippers, milking machines, grain separators, threshing machines, cream separators, churning receptacles, ice cream freezers, dough mixers, feed mixers, chicken hatcheries and numerous other machines and implements.

All these machines can be readily operated by small motors. The amount of power required to operate many of these is small. The presence of a plant of sufficient capacity to operate one or two particular machines often makes it possible to use the power for many of the other purposes. The amount of work that a small amount of power can do is judged from the following brief statements of what is actually being done with small existing plants.
Six horse power will drive a grain separator and thresh 2,500 bushels of oats in ten hours.
Three horse power furnishes all power needed to make 4,000 pounds of milk into cheese in one day.
Six horse power will run a feed mill grinding twenty bushels of corn an hour.
Five horse power grinds twenty-five to forty bushels of feed, or twelve bushels of ear corn an hour.
Seven horse power drives an eight separator, hay mill and corn crusher and corn sheller, grinding from twelve to fifteen bushels of good timothy.

Six horse power runs a heavy apple grater, grinding and pressing two bushels of apples and twenty bushels of apples an hour.
Five horse power will drive a six-inch circular saw, saving from fifty to seventy-five cords of stone wood and from bark oak in ten hours.
Six horse power saws all the wood four men can pile in cord.
Twelve horse power will drive a six-inch circular saw, saving 4,000 feet of oak or 5,000 feet of poplar in a day.
Ten horse power will run a brush cutter and blower, and elevate the same.
