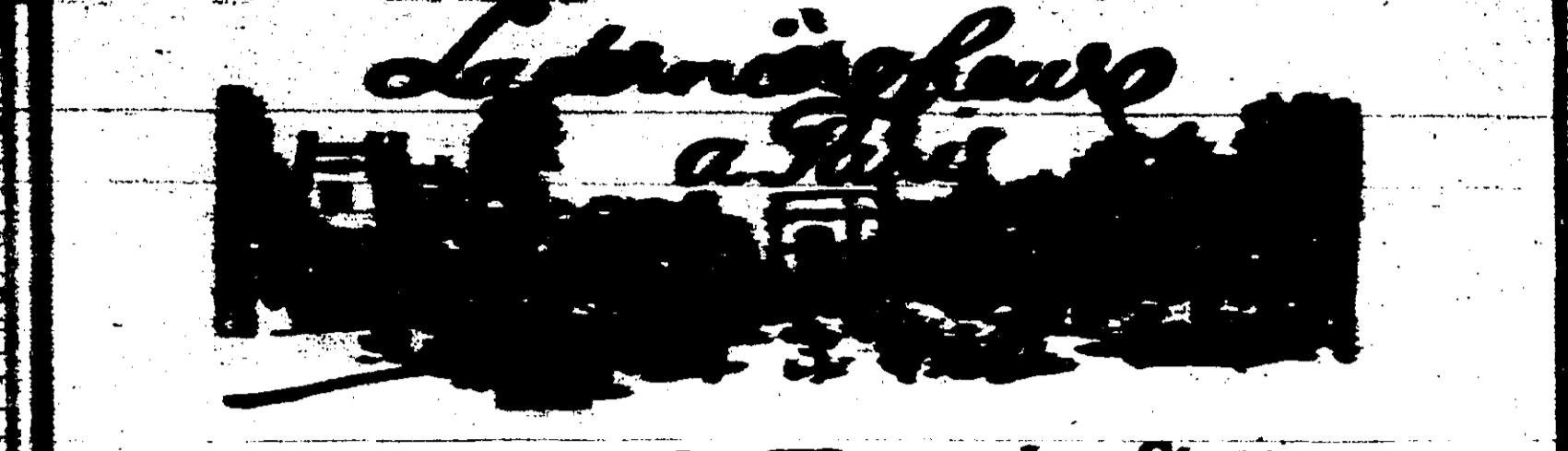

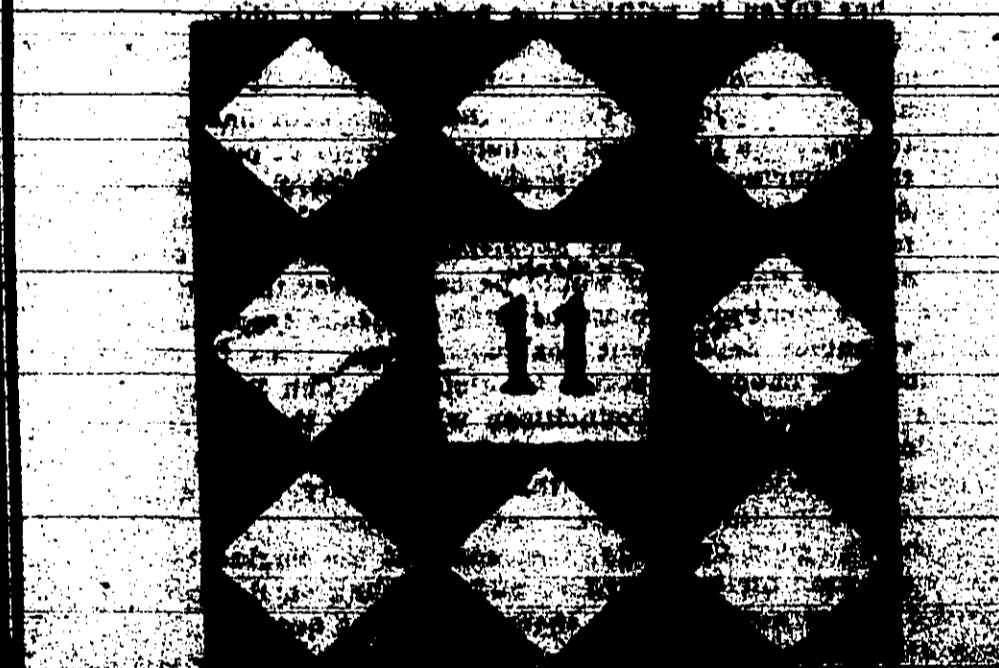

DEMOCRATS MUST NOW MAKE GOOD

(Continued From First Page.)

Philippine people are not ready for independence. That the sugar trust and other big American concerns intend that the United States shall retain the islands forever they have little doubt. The Filipino people are looking to the Democratic party as the only source from which they are likely to receive their freedom.

Examination of the last three democratic platforms would seem to make it appear that the triumphant Democrats are duty bound to look into the subject of the Philippine independence. Here are a few excerpts from these platforms:

From the platform of 1900—"We favor the immediate declaration of the nation's purpose to give the Philippines, first, a stable form of government; second, independence and third, protection from outside interference."

From the platform of 1904—"We insist that we ought to do for the Philippines what we have done already for the Cubans, and it is our duty to make that promise now and upon the guarantee of protection to citizens of our own and other countries resident there at the time of our withdrawal, set the Filipino people upon their feet, free and independent to work out their own destiny."

From the platform of 1908—"We condemn the experiment in imperialism as an inexcusable blunder which has involved us in enormous expenses, brought us no real benefit, and has weakened and laid our nation open to the charge of abandoning a fundamental doctrine of self government."

"In recognizing the independence of the Philippines, our government should retain such land as may be necessary for coaling stations and naval bases."

The absence from this city during the past week of the president and practically all his cabinet and men who give the air of a political center, has made a very quiet season here, and but for the movement of the troops to the frontier and the mystery surrounding it, we would hardly know we had an administration and a nation.

The unexplained action of the cabinet is a mystery to the nation. The situation has led to much discussion among politicians and there is no doubt will be a thorough investigation of the whole subject as soon as congress convenes in April.

General opinion here seems to be that there is no governmental policy involved and no doubt to be expected, but that it was purely a score of the money interests holding securities or properties that found for investment.

The postoffice department has authorized the establishment of fifty new rural free delivery routes on June 1. They are to be scattered over a number of states, Michigan leading with the greatest number, thirty-six, with Alabama and New Jersey four each, other states getting one and two each. The longest route is in Kansas, which is thirty-four miles long, and serves 100 families. New York has the next longest, fifteen miles and serves 261 families. Ohio has the longest, twelve miles and serves 100 families.

There are many rumors here regarding changes in the cabinet and while these are possibly correct, those on the inside insist upon the truth of the suggestion. It is generally reported that Secretary Knox is not in sympathy with the Russian situation, in fact that he was last year allied as to sending troops to the frontier and would not have approved it, and that he has been removed on several occasions by the president.

It is said that Secretary Carter will be attorney general and will be Attorney General and the present Attorney General, William C. Brewster, will go to the State Department. The President may possibly name Secretary Wood as Attorney General, and he would like to have Mr. Carter appointed as a political adviser.

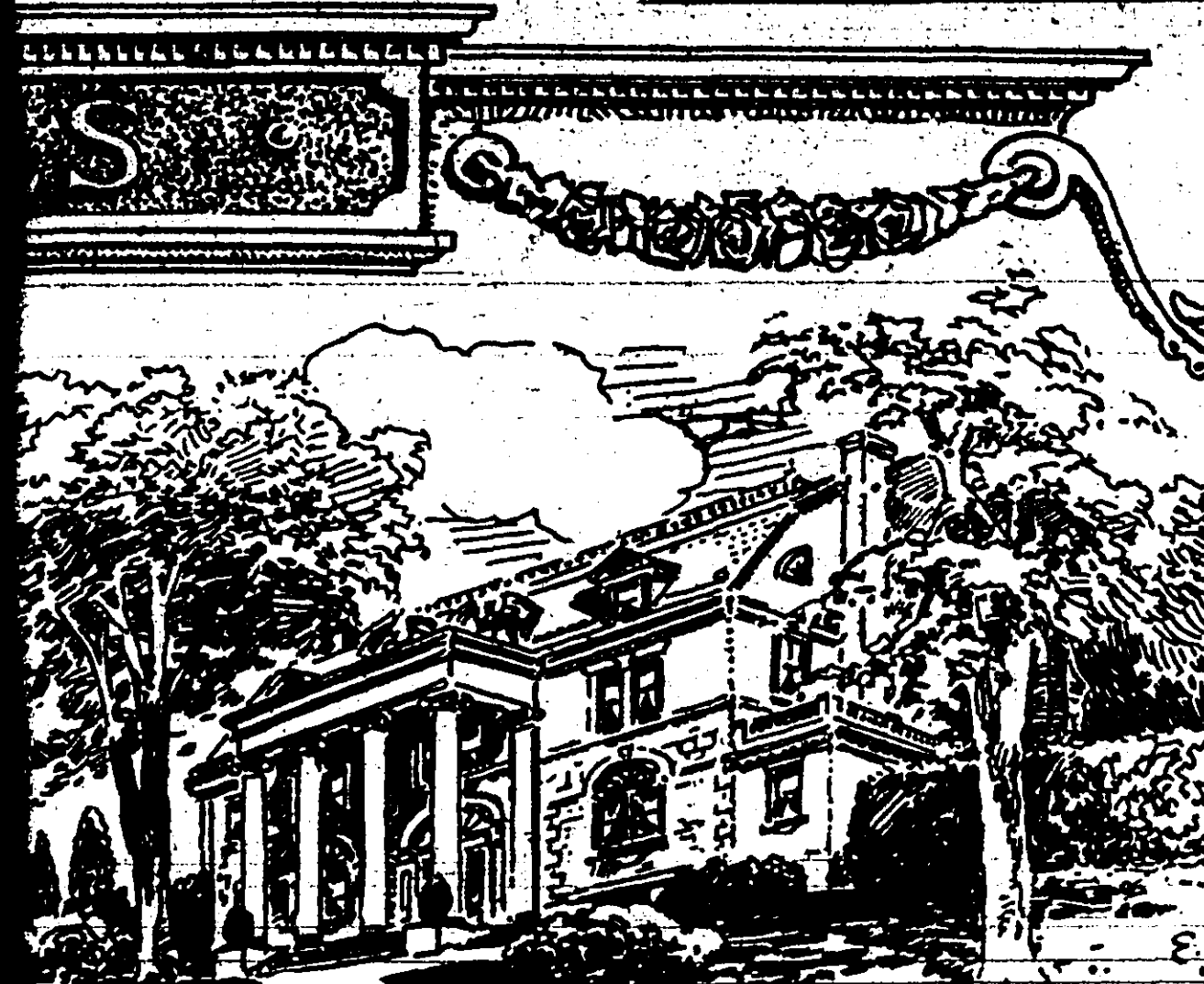

SPRING STYLES DISPLAYED ON FIFTH AVENUE—DRESS MATERIALS FOR ALL PURPOSES—GREAT VARIETY OF MODELS IN SUITS AND HATS.

NEW YORK, March 20.—The first touch of Spring in the air, and Fifth Avenue and all the other places where smart women are seen, blossomed out with new spring hats from the Gimbel store. The hats were displayed in the store, and the lovely fabrics displayed in their windows and the limited number of yards, required for present skimped skirts and short coats allows one to spend quite a bit more on materials without running over the usual figure for the spring outfit.

Soft Dresses. For all the hosts of lovely new dresses that can, with equal fitness, be worn indoors or out. Lingerie, the new wool backed satin and silk, and wool poplins easily take first place with women who like their gowns to stay fresh and smart looking, for any amount of wear demanded of them. This year the poplins come in shantung brocades and in the bordered goods now so fashionable.

NEW WAISTS. Among the most novel and attractive of the new blouses are those made of Ranshunde square the printed East India goods. The lower part of the waist is white and the neck and sleeves ruffs which are usually of hand made of white Irish or Coney lace. The printed pattern of the material makes the upper sleeve and body of the waist, and the collar and cuffs are bound in black satin and a tie to match is usually added.

Cotton Yokes.
