PARIS LETTER TO THE MEDICAL RECORD, MARCH 18, 1911. "Anti typhoid vaccination should not be formally forbidden except among subjects who are threatened with typhoid fever, for it may aggravate the infection. Anti-typhoid vaccines should be used only in perfectly healthy subjects, except in the case of military or naval personnel. Among the persons who may be expected to be benefited by anti-typhoid vaccination are physicians, male and female nurses in hospitals, young people coming from a healthy region to the city, typhoid fever, the population of cities, soldiers and marines who are employed in colonies where typhoid fever is epidemic. To persons who have had typhoid fever, vaccination is not recommended. It includes persons whose professional duties are in direct or indirect contact with bacilli of typhoid fever. Before this vaccination is given, the method of immunization is a very uncertain one, sometimes even dangerous. It is not as yet a definite recommendation (accidents, local in civil circles or in the army). We should not attempt it in special conditions, in which the risks of contamination are considerable."

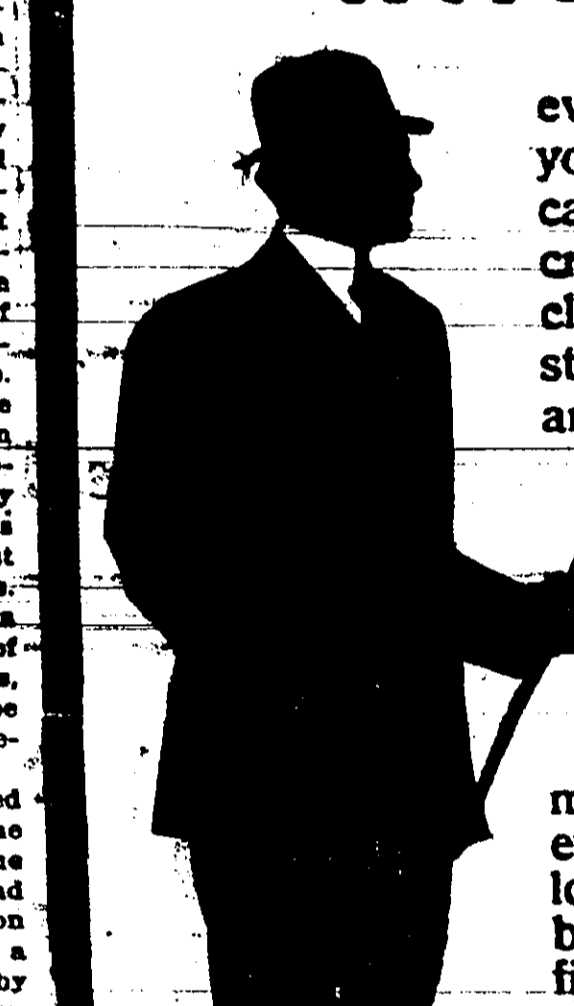

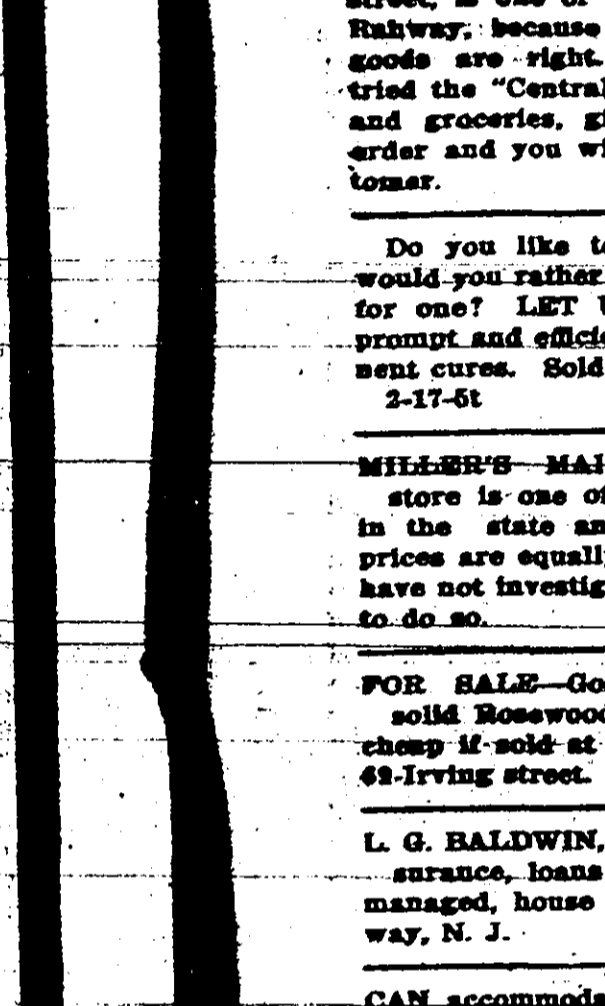
