It takes all the public to make up public opinion—and the whole public can be reached better by advertising than by any other form of publicity.

For advertising to be successful, you must find it impossible to adopt the plan of Mr. H. C. Brunt, who found out what good ad in his line was to be put in the Standard, and then straight out immediately beneath the other, reading simply, "Mr. John Hedges."
