The same is true of every other office, from the mayoralty down. It seems to be the habit to select each new mayor from among the old mayor's associates. Of course, there are exceptions to this rule, but it is nevertheless

In every community there is a certain well-defined class of individuals that are known as politicians. This class shades so gradually into the class of common citizens that it is impossible to tell where the "politician" class ends 'and the "common citizen" class begins, but the fact remains that under the present conditions in most cities the public officers are selected from that class of citizens that is distinctively politician.


