GOVERNOR NON-PARTISAN IN APPOINTMENTS

Very little available for manufacturing purposes. With the railroad and water facilities the factories will have shipping advantages that can not be had in some sections. The terminals of the canal in Chesapeake Creek, near South Amboy, will be a busy section, and it will undoubtedly improve that part of Middlesex county materially. The building of the ship canal will not in any way militate against the present canal from Hottelstown to New Brunswick, if the rates can ever be adjusted in a manner that will increase the trade of that waterway.

There will be plenty of speculation among the two political parties relative to what will happen to them under the German bill. All of the "machine" politicians of whatever political persuasion are fearful that they will suffer with the enactment of a measure that has for its primary purpose the purification of the ballot. The passage of the measure has been steadily advocated by Governor Wilson, and it has been considered as one of his great measures. It is not yet known whether it will be passed, but it is believed that it will be passed.

The report that former United States Senator John Kean has leased country on Fifth Avenue in New York City, has prompted the rumor that possibly the former senator would be a candidate for Governor in 1912. At the present time Mr. Kean is, presumably, out of politics, and yet he has not relinquished his interest in New Jersey affairs since he was at the State House some days ago when there was a bill under consideration to divide a township in Union county. His fine old Colonial home at Union, located in the township of the former Senator, was opposed to the proposed division of the territory. The committee had the matter under consideration, and it is possible that the bill may be passed in the present session of the legislature.

It is not believed that former Senator Kean has any notion of leaving New Jersey except perhaps for the winter or spring season. It is probable that he may intend to live in New York next winter instead of at Washington. Nor is it believed that he is actually "out of politics." That he may be a candidate for the United States Senate two years hence is a possibility. It is true that Senator Briggs will probably be a candidate to succeed himself, and with the best possible chance of getting the nomination, but that fact need not hinder a number of "retirees" anxious for the Senatorial toga, to get the light. Edward C. Stokes, former Governor, may decide that he will try it again; former Governor Fort would make a strong man, and possibly would be willing to allow his name to be used, upon an insistent demand from the people. There is plenty of time to consider candidates, and much may happen in the meantime.

As chairman of the State Board of Agriculture, Senator Prellinghuysen of Somerset, made an effective speech on Monday afternoon in support of the bill to increase the appropriation and the authority of the commission to check tuberculosis in cattle. Mr. Prellinghuysen explained that at present the laws were none too clear relative to the work of the commission. He also stated that it was possible for infected cattle to be shipped from New York and Pennsylvania into New Jersey, but no cattle of that kind could be shipped from this State to the States named.

He said he had made an investigation of the matter, and he found that there was need for more, more authority and more help to enforce the law properly. The Senate agreed with him, and the authority was broadened, and the appropriation was increased from \$20,000 to \$25,000.

The "German bill" was considered on Monday afternoon in the Senate. It was the subject of some debate, but there were no Senators who spoke directly in opposition to the measure. 


