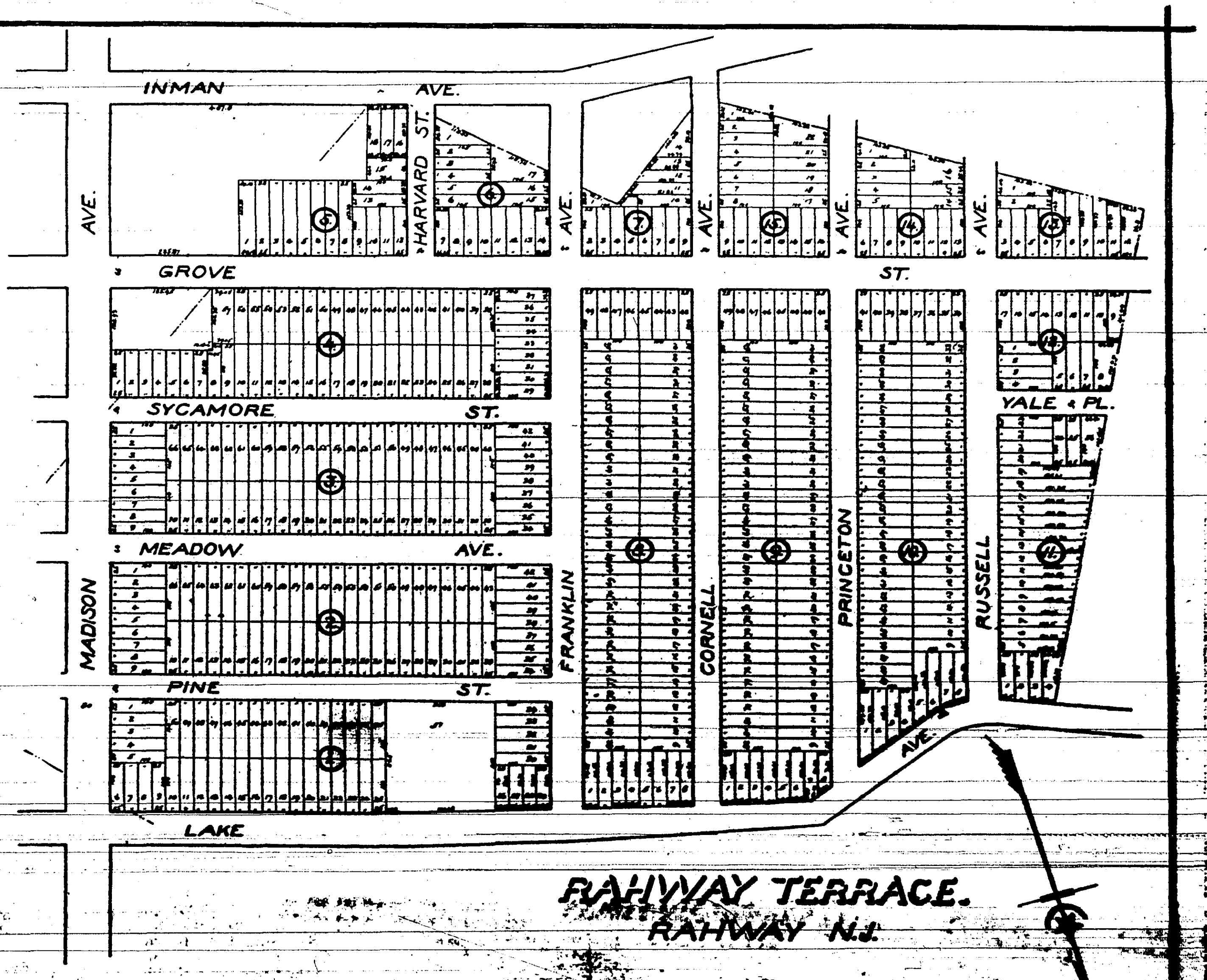

Then, again, there is the constant assumption among doctors that they are uniquely ethical in that on a profession their constant object is to relieve and destroy disease and to amputate their own incomes.
