Excise Ordinance

AN AMENDMENT to Code of Ordinances of the Board of Excise Commissioners of the City of Rahway, regulating the sale of spirituous, vinous, malt, brewed, distilled or fermented liquors, and to establish regulations for the granting, transfer and revocation of licenses, and for the imposition of penalties for the violation of the provisions of this code of ordinances, passed May 21, 1904.

Section 3. Paragraph 1. Class 1. Shall be applied to and be issued for the sale at any inn or tavern, hotel, restaurant, saloon, restaurant, or other place spirituous, vinous, or other liquors in any quantity. The fee to be charged for this class of license shall be Seven Hundred (\$700.00) Dollars.

Section 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed and that this ordinance shall take effect immediately. Passed May 1st, 1911.
