The general impression prevails here at this time that Congress will adjourn about the middle of July, and that little legislation will be accomplished, owing principally to the antagonism developing in each of the parties. Speaker-Clark and Mr. Underwood are opposed to free wool, while the "democratic" party are demanding it. Though regular Republicans in the Senate have decided to support Gallinger as President pro tem, while the insurgents refuse to vote for him, thereby creating a deadlock, a proceeding scarcely ever heard of in this body. While these differences seem slight they indicate the hostility existing in the ranks of both parties, and may prevent any important legislation at the extra session.

800 Enthusiastic Progressives At Dollar Dinner in Newark

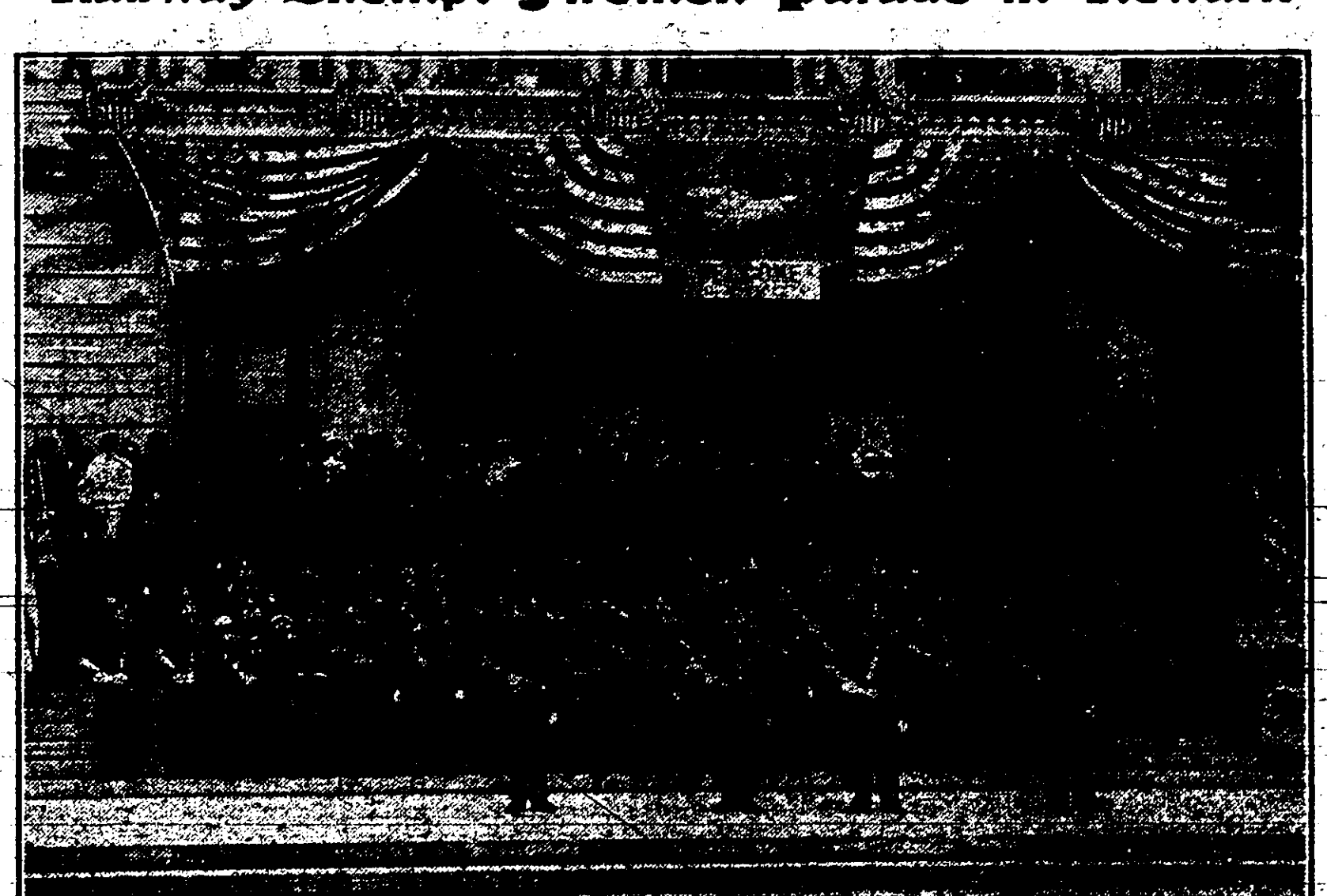
SENATOR CUMMINGS THE ORATOR OF THE OCCASION

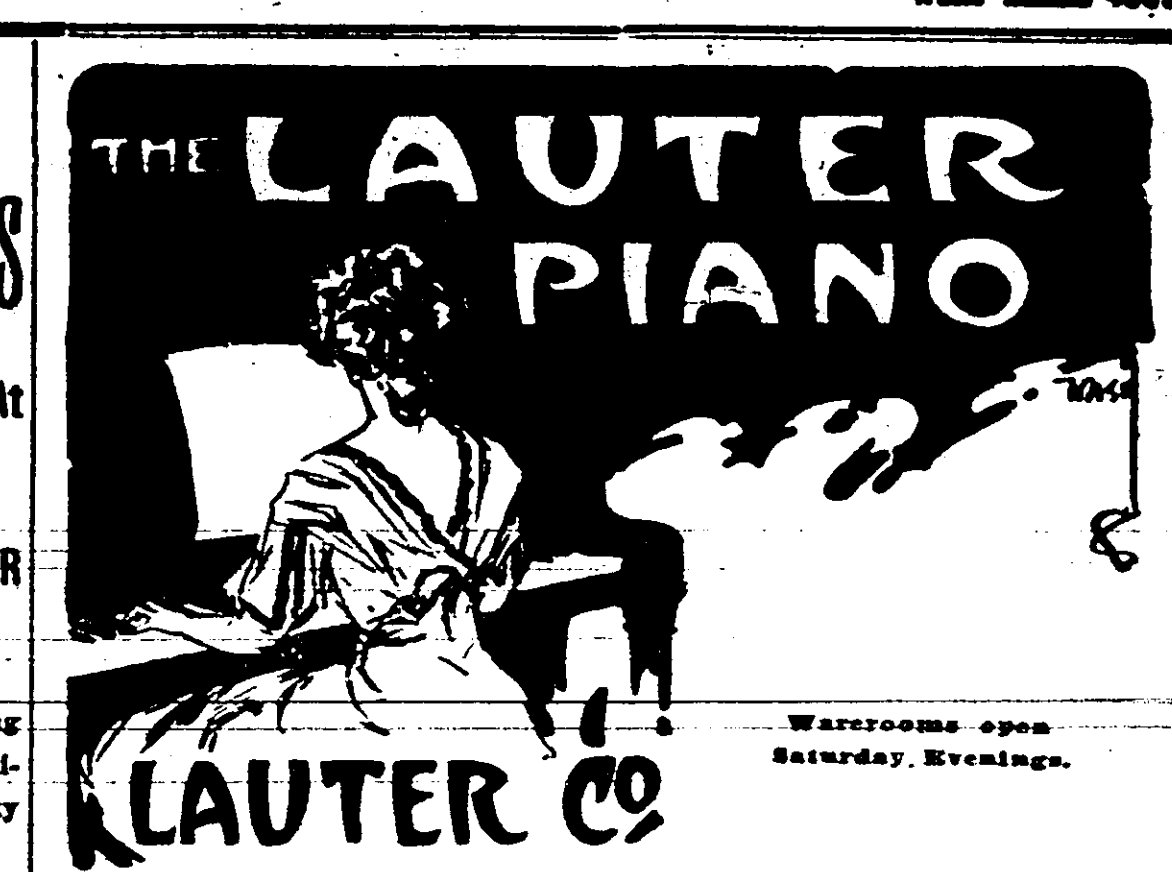
