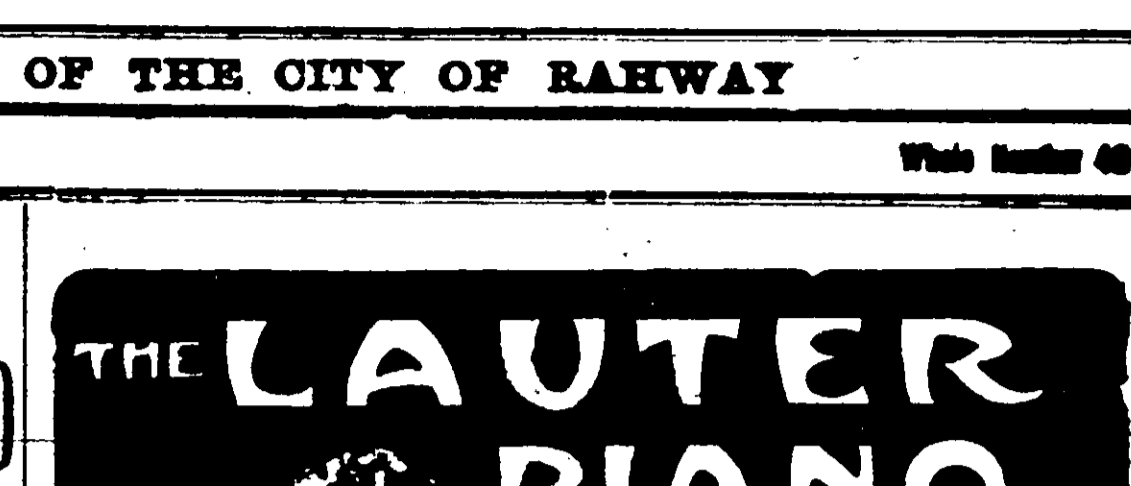

They would warm, the section was eliminated. That the railroad company shall not decrease local train service, was next taken up for consideration.

Councilman Martin said he would like to know where these requests came from, they were not in the original ordinance when submitted to Mr. Shepard of the Pennsylvania railroad.

Section 50, which provides a penalty of \$100 per day if the work of elevation is not completed within the specified time, was taken up for consideration and eliminated from the ordinance.

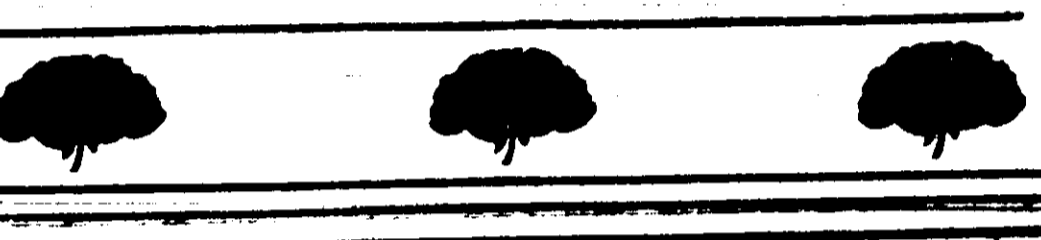
