Girls' Names

What They Mean—Famous People That Bore the Name—The name in History, Literature, Etc.

SIBYL

Homely wisdom of the Scotch and Irish shows in many ways—and shows quite conclusively in the circumstances that so many Scotch and Irish names are called Sibyl, for Sibyl means "wise girl."

Some learned investigators identify the name with the Italian word Sibilla, signifying "wise old woman," but I prefer the less strained explanation namely that Sibyl comes from a Greek compound word, the translation of which reads "Zoe-Councilor."

Zoe is Greek for Jupiter, and the Sibyls were a sort of female ministry to him. The idea should be full of suggestions for our friends, the suffragists. The Germans, with their hankering for erudition, translate Sibyl "Zoe-Councilor."

The oldest Sibyl's emblem and fortification is the serpent. The most celebrated of the Sibyls was one who dwelt in Cumae, Italy. She came upon a time she appeared before the king and offered for sale nine books of prophecy. When he refused to buy them she destroyed three and offered the remaining at the same price. When the king again refused she burned three more and for them asked as much as for the nine. She obtained the original price and these books became oracles of the Romans. They were burned when Nero freed Rome.

Ancient mythology recognized 12 Sibyls, but in later writings 12 are recorded. The Sibyls were supposed to possess the power of interceding with the gods and to make revelations, which were preserved in sacred archives. Sibyl is an ancient English form of the name. Sibilla is popular in Scotland and Ireland. English and American parents that prefer a high sounding name use Sibylla, but a strict friend seldom do.

Sibylla, though, is quite the thing among Irish ladies, but some hold that it has nothing to do with the ancient Greek name, but is a contraction of the ancient Gaelic Seibhthach, which means "lady of property." After all a wise woman and a "lady of property" are almost synonymous terms. The Irish diminutive Sibille sounds prettier than the German Sibilla, pronouncing the "i" like "ee."

The Italians use both Sibilla and Sibylla. The latter is also the French form, substituting "y" for the "i." I might interpose here that Sibyl "Faust" is not a male adaptation of Sibyl. It's a Teutonic name, meaning "conquering prince." On American grand opera programs it is usually misspelled with an "e" after "i" in the first syllable.

Sibyl countries use the German form Sibilla, others substitute "a" for the final "a." In Russian it is Sibylla. The Estonians use the very shortest form, Sibi, which hardly recognizes itself. On old English birth registers we find both Sibilla and Sibylla.

In the northern countries Sibyls achieved early popularity on account of its similarity to the name of Thor's wife, Sif or Siff. King Krystof, of Sweden, owned a sacred cow which he used as a war horse. Her name was Sibylla, in Swedish it means that which is sacred.

The Normans introduced Sibyl into England, the name having been popular among the Norman chivalry long before the conquest. One of the early queens of Jerusalem was so named and old ballads of Spain and Portugal sing the praises of Sibilla and Sibylla.

Sibyllin, of Pavia, gained renown as a saintly woman, her body being marked "with the crown of thorns and the whip-wales of Jesus." Michael Angelo painted the Sibyls in the Sistine chapel, Rome. The most famous of American Sibyllas was Sibyl Sanderson, the beautiful California girl, who became the inspiration of the great Massenet and who died young as Madam Antonia Gercy in Paris. Of the hundred thousands who admired Mary Garden in "Thais" few knew that if there had been no Sibyl Sanderson there would be no Massenet opera called "Thais."

UNION DEMONSTRATION OF STATE TO RALLY.

HARRISBURG, June 16—Champer Clark, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Governor Woodrow Wilson of New Jersey, two Democratic Presidential possibilities, were speakers at the launching of the Federation of Democratic Clubs of Pennsylvania in this city yesterday.

Nearly two thousand persons, mostly Democrats, greeted the speakers. It was a most successful day for the party. Many had come to "see up" the two men on the same platform, the opportunity was afforded, as both spoke at their best. Furthermore both pointed out the Democratic Clubs of the State in 1912, and both were cheered for the party. Both received compliments.
