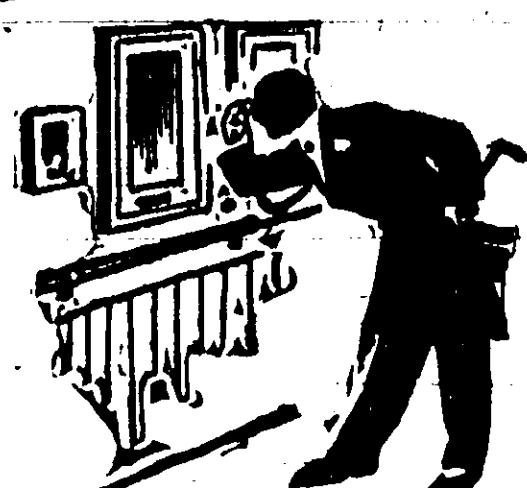

WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON, June 23—Why has the government been unable to control the trusts? While this question has not as yet been definitely answered, the House investigating committee are bringing out testimony which tends to throw light on the subject. At least to the end of showing that the great trusts of the country have at some time or another had most of the government prosecutors on their payroll.

United States Attorney General Wickham leads the list. Under oath he admitted that the last thing he did before taking charge of the prosecuting machinery of the nation was to draw down his share of a \$2000 fee from the sugar trust as a member of the New York law firm of Strong and Cackwaller.

A petition was signed by nearly all of the property owners on Main street, between the railroad and Hazelwood avenue, asking that the money proposed to be appropriated for the clearing of streets be used to improve at once the value and usefulness of Main street by paving it.
