To Avoid Unkind Criticism: Say Nothing - Do Nothing - Be Nothing.

There is one protestant argument that will never again occupy the place in American politics that it has in the past.

That is the argument that a high protection wall is never necessary to enable American manufacturers to compete in foreign markets with foreign manufactured goods.

It is the argument that the reason this stock protectionist argument will never again perform its valuable mission for the Republic is because of a speech delivered in the House by Wm. C. Redfield, of New York, who is a manufacturer himself, and who for 15 years has been selling American manufactures in foreign countries.

Redfield contended and proved that the difference in daily wage at home and abroad should not be the basis of determining the amount of protection to be applied to a given article.

He cited instance after instance in which he sold articles manufactured by 20 a day American employes in countries where labor received less than one dollar a day.

Redfield took the position that American manufacturers did not need as much protection as they were now enjoying "to protect them from foreign competition" because they are successfully competing with foreign manufactures in all parts of the world.

"How does it happen," demanded Redfield, "that in a quotation recently made for machinery to a mine in Japan the American price was 21% less than the English price?"

"How does it happen that 750 American locomotives are running upon the Japanese railways, and upon those of Formosa and upon those of Manchuria? These are sold in open competition with the makers in Great Britain?"

Redfield related an incident between an American salesman who recently took a large contract from the Japanese Imperial State Railways and one of the managers of the Imperial Railways shop.

The Japanese official was under the impression that he could manufacture locomotives cheaper than an American plant because Japanese wages are but one-tenth of American wages.

"Both men got out their check books," said Redfield, "and they found that the fact was the labor cost for locomotives on the same specifications was three and one-half times greater in the Japanese shops than in the American shops. And this is a perfectly normal fact and not an abnormal one."

Redfield said when he was in Calcutta, India, recently, his agent pointed to a pair of American made shoes he was wearing.

"I paid \$3.50 for those shoes," said the agent. "It is the regular American \$5.00 shoe."

Redfield said that when he returned to New York he found the same shoe selling on Broadway for \$5.00. "I shall be glad to give names and addresses to any member who inquires in private."

Redfield gave a score of similar instances.

It has been said that the noblest epitaph ever written is on the grave of John Richard Owen—"He died learning." In this epitaph of the great English historian is found the spirit of modern education and especially of that comparatively new educational movement known as University Extension which has shown such vigorous and widespread growth in our country in recent years.

The traditional educational theory held that one should get one's schooling once for all in the brief period of youth and then be done with it like the moose. University Extension teaches that education is a life process, ending only with the grave, and seeks to carry systematic and continuous efforts for self-culture through the whole life—placing them in the same category as business, politics, religion or other recognized needs of existence.

Nothing better illustrates the growth and vitality of the University Extension movement than the work of the American Society for the Extension of University Teaching of Philadelphia, the parent University Extension body in the United States. In the twenty-first annual report of the Society, just issued, the table of annual membership shows that this organization has steadily expanded from 200 members eight years ago to nearly 2500 today, each twelve months displaying an advance over the preceding years. The Society has now the largest numbers in its history and is the most important voluntary educational institution for University Extension purposes either in this country or in Europe.

Through its many Centres established in various parts of the East, it has spread the gospel of culture among the ranks of the people in season and out for two decades, supported during this time by the income from a small endowment and membership dues but largely by subscriptions from friends of education who recognize its high public mission and believe in its utility. In the season that has just closed, 104 courses totaling 618 educational lectures were delivered at the Centres to audiences numbering over 50,000 persons.

While statistics of courses and attendance convey some conception of the Society's activity, it is impossible to translate into mathematics the significance and value of the educational service that such work renders. In many communities to which the Society sends its lecturers, the "Centres" of the work form a common nucleus of intellectual and social interests, about which the best elements of the place gather. They help to enrich and refine local life, stimulating all that is best, and frequently cultivate lines of denominational cleavage, social clique and political affiliation. To them are sent lecturers drawn from the leading universities of this country and of England, and chosen not merely for their ability in the fields of scholarship but also for their human qualities of spirit and personality. In meeting their assignments, the lecturers are frequently subjected to long hours of study and to anxious thinking and an activity of genuine culture that returns many times over the effort and sacrifice their establishment and conduct may involve.

A Centre for University Extension in this community would make a direct contribution to the life of our people and doubtless could readily be organized if a few of our public-spirited citizens could be found to do the preliminary work. A community never suddenly awakens to such ideas. They must first be sown and an agency of genuine culture that returns many times over the effort and sacrifice their establishment and conduct may involve.






