POST OFFICE TO CLOSE ON SUNDAY

Mahway Postmaster Issues Orders - Will Give Employees Heat Day.

The postmaster has received orders to close the post office Sundays commencing next Sunday and in accordance all delivery of mail from the local post office will be discontinued after next Sunday.

The lobby of the office will be open from 10 a. m. to 12 o'clock noon, which will enable box holders to get their mail if they so desire. There will be one collection from the street letter boxes at 9:45 on Sunday morning.

The last mail for all points will close at 12 o'clock noon. The closing of the post office on Sundays is in line with a movement which has taken place all over the country, and which has been encouraged by the Lord's Day Alliance and the Christian Endeavor Society, as well as a large majority of the patrons of the office.

Over 1,000 patrons of the post office in this city signed petitions favoring the closing of the office on Sunday and very few have opposed the plan. The closing of the office will mean a day of rest for the employees of the local office who have been compelled to work on Sundays heretofore, in order that a small portion of the population of the city might receive mail on Sunday.

In case of urgent necessity in the delivery of a letter on Sunday, a special delivery stamp will insure its delivery.

The employees of the post office appreciate the indulgence of the petition for the Sunday closing of the post office.
