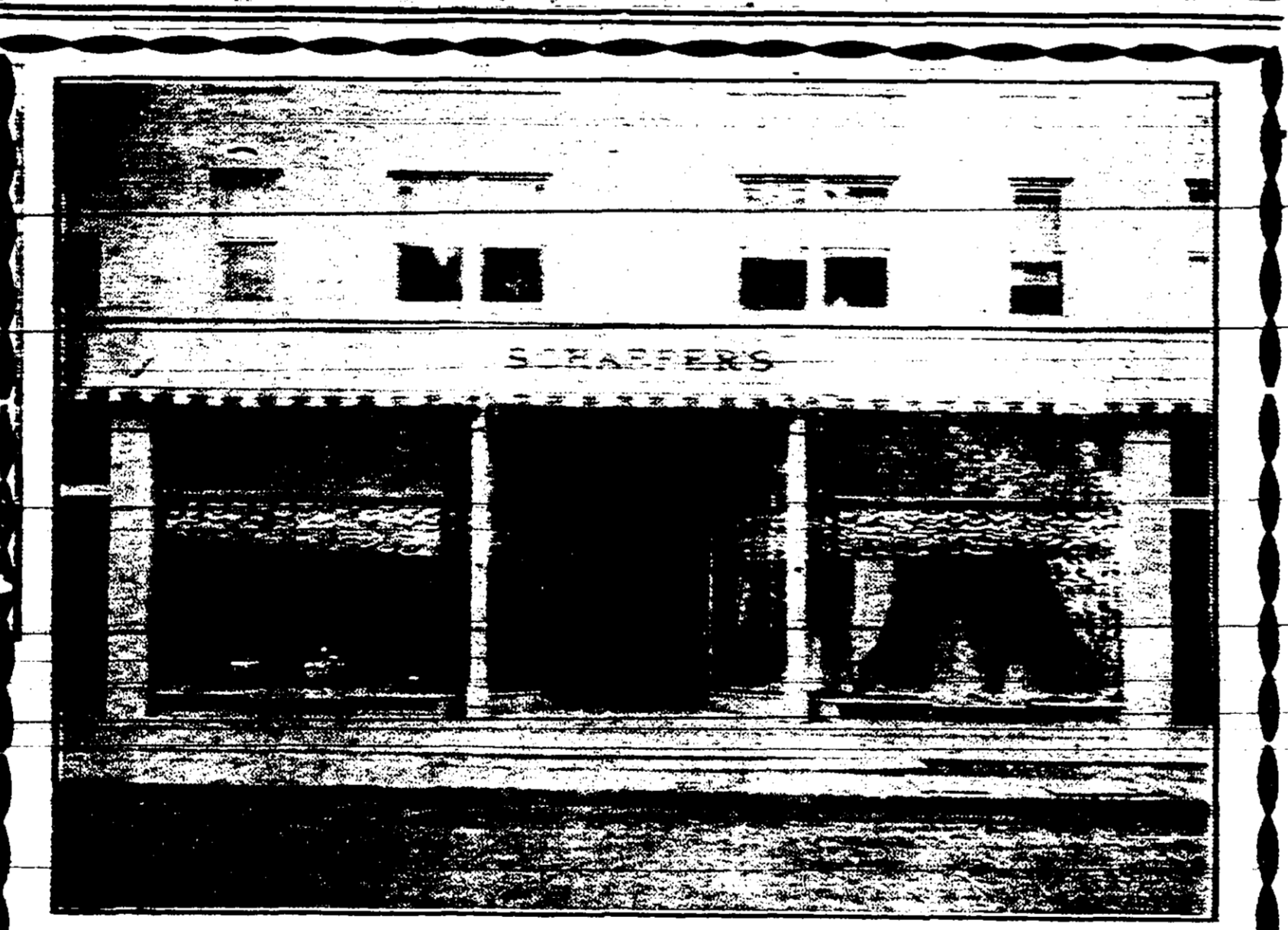

THE WELFARE EXHIBIT IN NEW YORK; WHAT IT HAS ACCOMPLISHED FOR THE CHILDREN.

Two years ago the Welfare Association was formed to concentrate the stored wisdom of the leading social workers, thinkers, and investigators, on the difficult problem of safeguarding the children so that we shall produce a nation of strong, happy, upright men and women.

Last Winter's "Child Welfare Exhibit" held in the great Armory of the Seventy-first Regiment was an effort to show what was being done and left undone for the city's children. No one who saw that exhibit will ever forget it, and the throngs of people of all classes, ages and conditions, that came day after day and night after night, testified eloquently that the heart of the City had been reached, and widespread interest aroused.

Childish Demonstrations. Some of the most fascinating exhibits were the spaces where boys from the manual training school were making gay, strong "do-witt" toys, and the play and toy stores, especially the dolls house furnishings that every small girl was anxious to see.

In the Centre Court. In the very centre of the vast drill hall, a court was used every afternoon for the evening of talks, moving pictures, folk dances, etc., all bearing on the healthful enjoyment—and wise-up—bringing of the child.

Trained Volunteers. The meaning of the exhibit was explained by the volunteer workers, who showed mothers the economy and food values of different supplies, and gave hints on wise buying of materials and clothing for the family.

Cartoons and Statuary. A significant group of statuary by Mr. Louis Potter, showed a grandfather, mother and father bent under life's heavy burden, with a little child already drooping in the shadow of the same fate.

It is only a few months since the Welfare Exhibit closed here, but its soul, like John Brown's, is marching on. Many of the exhibits have been transferred, intact to Chicago and other large cities, where little children are holding out their hands for the cities made of schools, playgrounds, innocent engagements and health safeguards, that will raise the standard of citizenship and shorten the list of criminals and paupers.

Business and Philanthropy. One does not customarily think of business and philanthropy as associated, but we are learning that helpfulness and neighborly kindness is often the best sort of practical business. Firms that manufacture articles for children were intensely interested in the Welfare Exhibit and many of them are giving efficient and practical help in solving the problems there presented.

These are only a few of the results so far evidenced, but the influences set going are working in many directions for the good of the children.

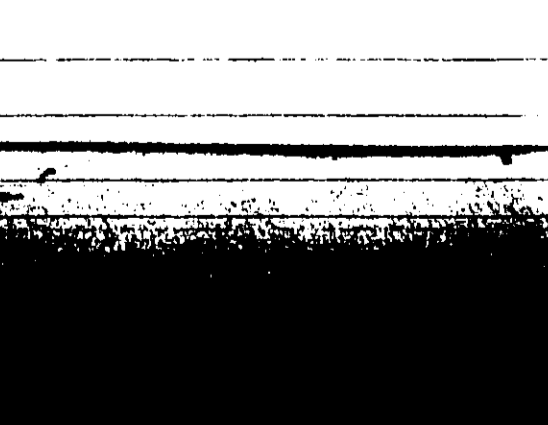

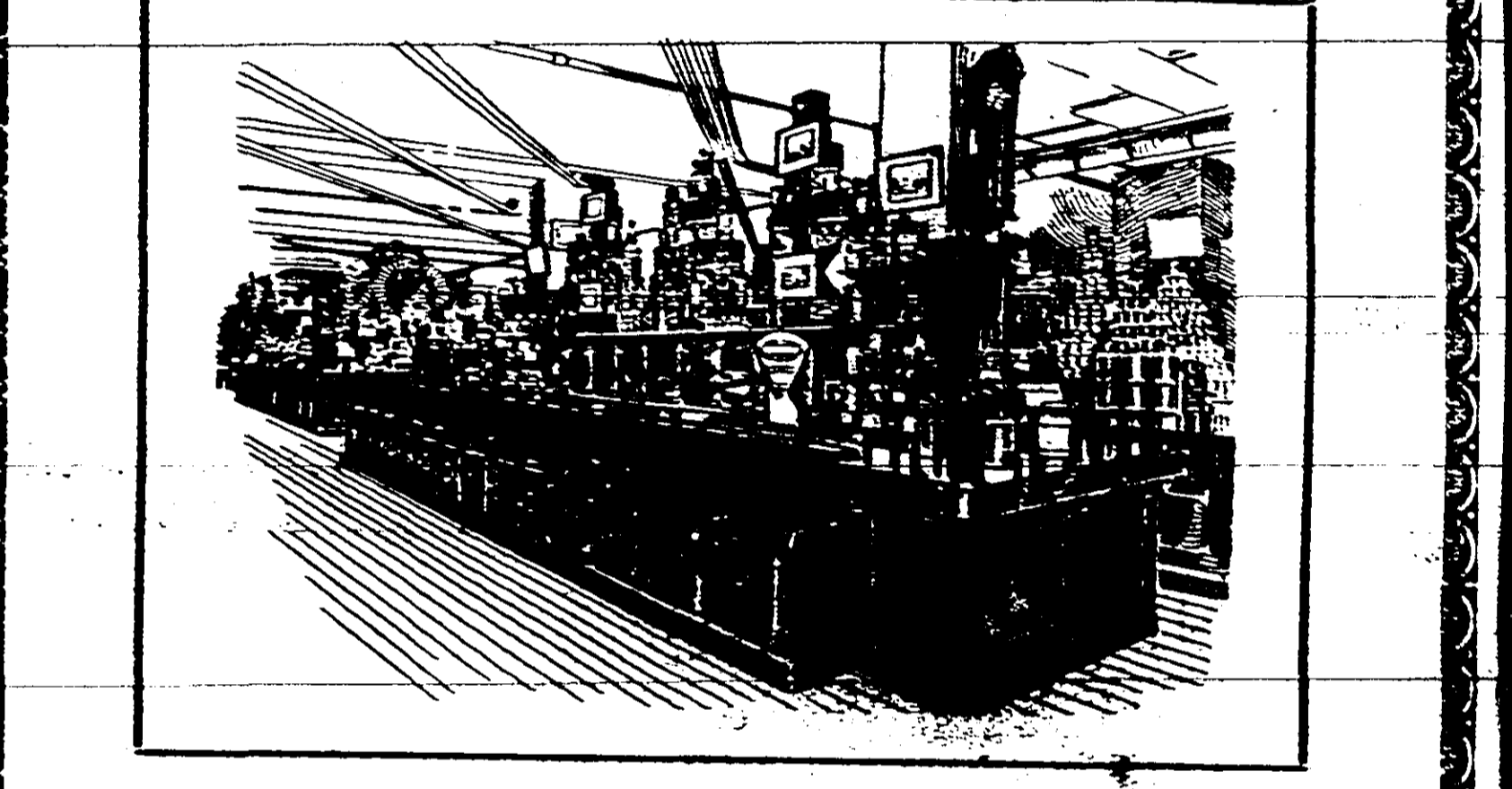
