"Mr. Furber next gave the names of the cities and the population where the commission form of government is being used. The manner in which this government is manipulated so successfully in Switzerland was also portrayed. He compared the commossion form to the board of directors of a large corporation, showing that the menchosen are usually picked out because of their ability. Nothing goes on in this city or any other that cannot be handled as a business.' The opportunity to hold a commissioner directly responsible for his acts was described by Mr. Furber, and to show the inefficiency of the present city government he pointed out that on June 20 an ordinance was passed by the Common Council extending the fire limits, and that since that-time two buildings had been built that did not most the fire code reulrements. He showed that it was apparently the duty of no

particular official to see that this ordinance was enforced. "The alleged plan of each coundiso condemned by the speaker, aged is without doubt."




