NEW EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

The New State Commissioner of Education, Calvin N. Kendall, has chosen J. Brognard Betts, who for many years has been assistant superintendent, and who is remarkably well posted on the four schools of the schools of New Jersey, Mr. Betts to act as Mr. Kendall's immediate assistant, with authority to sign documents and to conduct other business in the absence of his chief.

Three other assistants are still to be named, and the impression is growing that none of these positions will go to educators now employed within the State. The posts that remain to be filled are for deputy commissioner of high schools, deputy commissioner of manual training and industrial schools, and deputy commissioner of State school matters for believing that none of the very great number of New Jersey candidates who are accepted, is that there are very few if any educators here who are qualified on the grounds of who they would be.

A recent issue of the Witham Journal of Witham, England, contained the following: "The first annual report of Dr. Burdette, the school inspector of Witham, is a most interesting and instructive document of 60 and 70 pages. The school contains in all numbers 37,000 children, and about 75 per cent of these are from defective sight and require glasses—close on 2,000 pair of spectacles.

"No fewer than 425 have thoroughly bad teeth, and though it is not proposed to have dental treatment for these, it is pointed out that teachers and parents may do much to instruct children in the care and preservation of their teeth."

Some of the most eminent dentists, medical and scientific have expressed the opinion that the early decay of the teeth and defective eyesight are some of the evil results of vaccination. Albert Carter, a London surgeon, writes that during a winter of 1898-99 he had examined the teeth of men in nearly all conditions of civilization and barbarism, and the outcome of his observations amount to this: "The men, wherever the people are vaccinated their teeth are sound, but wherever the practice of vaccination has been introduced the teeth will be people deteriorate just in proportion as the population comes under the influence of vaccines. This London surgeon dentist unequivocally declares that 'vaccination rots the teeth out of nation.'"

Dr. H. Valentine Knaggs, a London medical gentleman, and the author of several articles, says that vaccination "must have a profoundly injurious effect upon the just budding permanent teeth." The late Herbert Spencer expressed the opinion that vaccination was largely responsible for defective teeth and eyesight in children. Is it, then, any wonder that spectacles and sets of teeth are so largely required by school children?

LOCAL OPTION

When the question of local option was being discussed by the people of Macomb county a very energetic protest against the movement in that direction came from Mt. Clemens. It would hurt business, it was declared, and Mr. Clemens needs to be an "open" town in order to make it profitable possible. Local option does hurt some kinds of business. It doesn't disturb factories or mills or machines or farms or stores, or any of the legitimate means through which men earn money or spend it for themselves or their families; but it will hurt, and it should hurt, some persistent features of "business" at Mt. Clemens. Two visitors to that city, a man and his wife from Akron, Ohio, were taken last week to a house on Front street, and selected \$40 for an alleged examination by a local physician. The participants in the affair have been arrested but an escort is being made to haul it up for fear that it will disturb business at Mt. Clemens. Local option would harmonize with Mt. Clemens "old-time" policy, but the latter relation to grafters and swindlers and to saloon traffic of law provided an opportunity for choosing between the one and the other, which makes the issue very clear. Mt. Clemens has lost in volume of business, in property values, and in future possibilities through the effort on the part of some of its people, acquiesced in by others, to become a resort for a class whose operations require deliberate disregard of law by the community in which they live and thrive. Only recently, when Governor Osborn was captured twenty stray canines during the past week, thirteen of which were put to death after having been kept a sufficient length of time.

At the Tuesday night session of Common Council, the question of inactivity of the Sealer of Weights and Measures was presented by Councilman Wright and Messrs. again.

Weights and Measures Again. The question was not directed at Councilman Wright and Messrs. again, but at the time of his appointment.

Man Reckie who could, doubtless, have given him full information. After considerable delay Councilman Ludlow stated that he had reported, as chairman of City Property Committee, the cost of new apparatus for the scale and his report had been received and filed, without any action whatsoever.

To those who are on the inside this is not surprising. Everyone knows that Councilman Wright has his safe side and is not a "City Fighter". In this case it is not surprising that the sealer of weights and measures became so active in the performance of his duties.

He understood that he was engaged for a particular purpose to enforce the law against merchants and vendors who might be cheating the people of Rahway. He took his appointment seriously and started out to show that he was in the saddle for a purpose. Poor fellow—the Hitts dreamed that at the very first crack he would run up against a merchant who was like a brother to a certain member of Council. The sealer discovered weights which were not correct. He threatened punishment if not corrected. He charged for his services as inspector as provided by law. He should have selected his first point of attack with greater care. He should have employed a detective first to learn which, if any, merchant had a personal friend in Council to defend him, and then the sealer should have confided his efforts to such merchant and vendors. No one familiar with present day politics would expect to investigate the methods and practices of business men without having a "come-back" through higher sources.

In the present instance under discussion, it is said, the victim of the sealer's investigation immediately appeared to his friend, the Councilman, as a result of which the sealer was instructed to leave his testing apparatus with the City Clerk from whom it was later taken by a Councilman, never to be returned. Months have elapsed and the sealer has been unable to perform his duties.

When the matter was brought up in the Council on Tuesday night and Chairman Ludlow, of the City Property Committee, explained what had been done several months ago, the matter was dropped like a hot potato.

Dr. Harvey W. Wilby, storm petrel between food dopers and the Tart administration, has been a militant government chemist for 28 years. Packets of embalmed beef are arrayed against him because of his fight against the use of benzoate of soda. Benzoate increases the profits of embalmed beef packers because it will "retard" and preserve meats that have become putrescent. The cost of manufacture of benzoate and sausage may be materially reduced by using water and cereals. Water costs nothing and the cereal is cheaper than meat. The result is a cheapening of the product and a lowering of the food value. But when water and cereal is used the meat begins to sour. It is to prevent this souring process that the benzoate of soda may be used. Chemists declare benzoate is of no earthly use to the manufacturer who puts pure foods upon the market.

Dr. Wilby also fought the bleached flour interests in the last ditch. He exposed the injurious coloring used in candied sold to children. He stubbornly opposed the use of sulphur as a fruit preservative. He secured the removal of the tax on denatured alcohol. He exposed frauds without number in patent medicines. It was Wilby who started the war on the use of narcotics and other poisons in soda fountain drinks. And he stubbornly fought the whiskey trust until he was at last overruled by President Tart.

These facts tell better than a long article could why it is up to the food dopers to get Wilby's goat. Also why it is up to the people to see that they don't get it.

An important measure pending before Congress is House Resolution No. 670, introduced by Congressman James T. Lloyd of Missouri. The measure is aimed particularly at the action of the Tart administration in prohibiting postal employees from organizing and the still more remarkable right to petition Congress, or even to give members of Congress information until it has first been censored by their superiors.

The constitution guarantees to every citizen of the United States the right to petition Congress. The Lloyd resolution occupies the novel role, therefore, of having for its purpose the restoration to government employees of rights they are entitled to under the constitution, but which rights have been taken away from them by the President in his desperate effort to prevent a further leakage of information injurious to the republican party such as occurred in the Ballinger case.

The access fees of the Excise Board, resulting from the increased liquor license, would doubtless more than cover the increased cost of a paid fire department. To what better purpose could the money be dedicated. At present it is used to purchase and retire city bonds, but that process has in no way decreased the tax rate.

An up-to-date paid fire department, under a Commission Government, would do more to create a favorable impression abroad for Rahway than any other thing that could happen. It would mark our city as a city of progress.

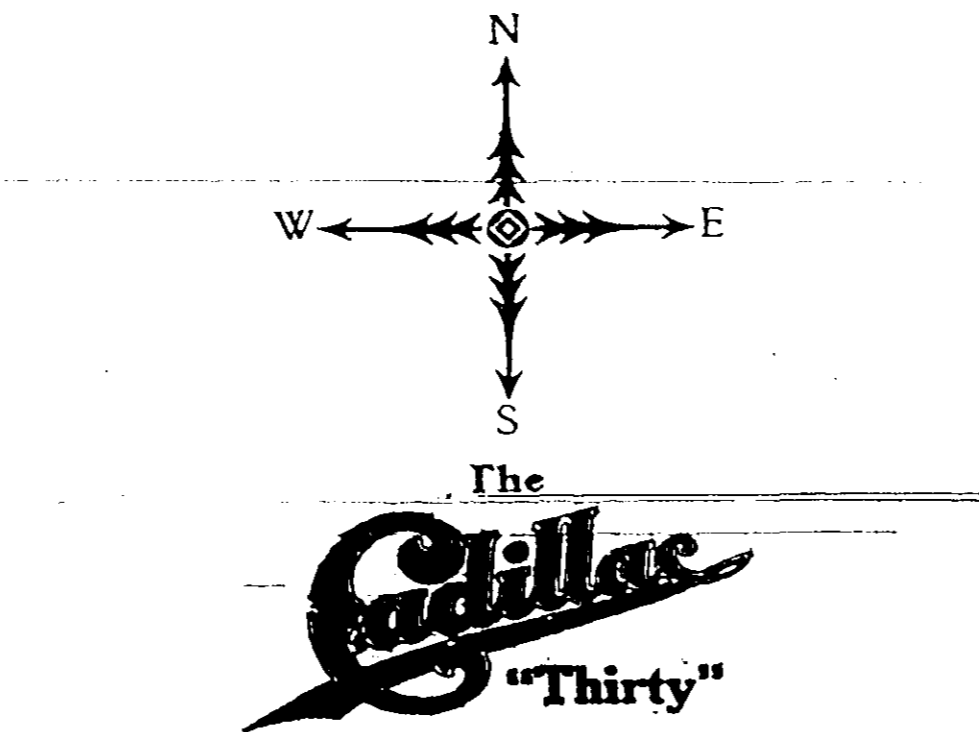
A MOTOR FOR HOUSEWORK

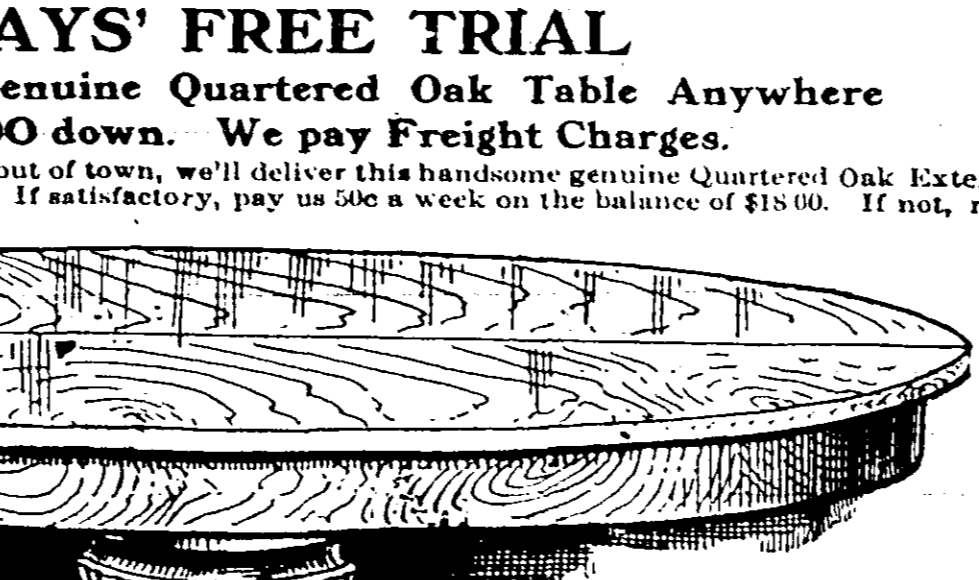

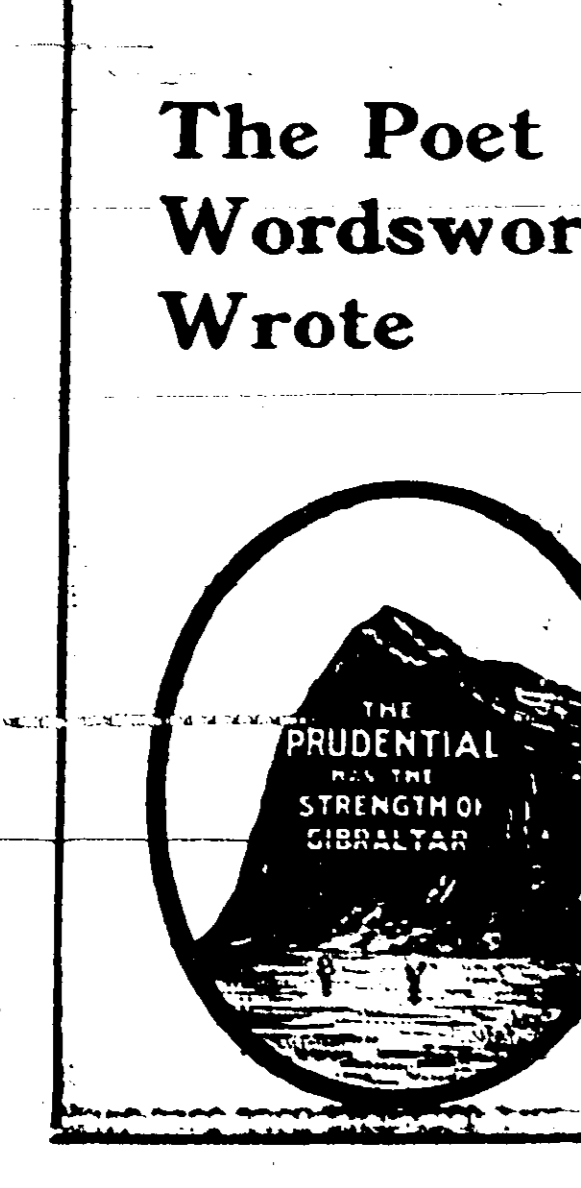

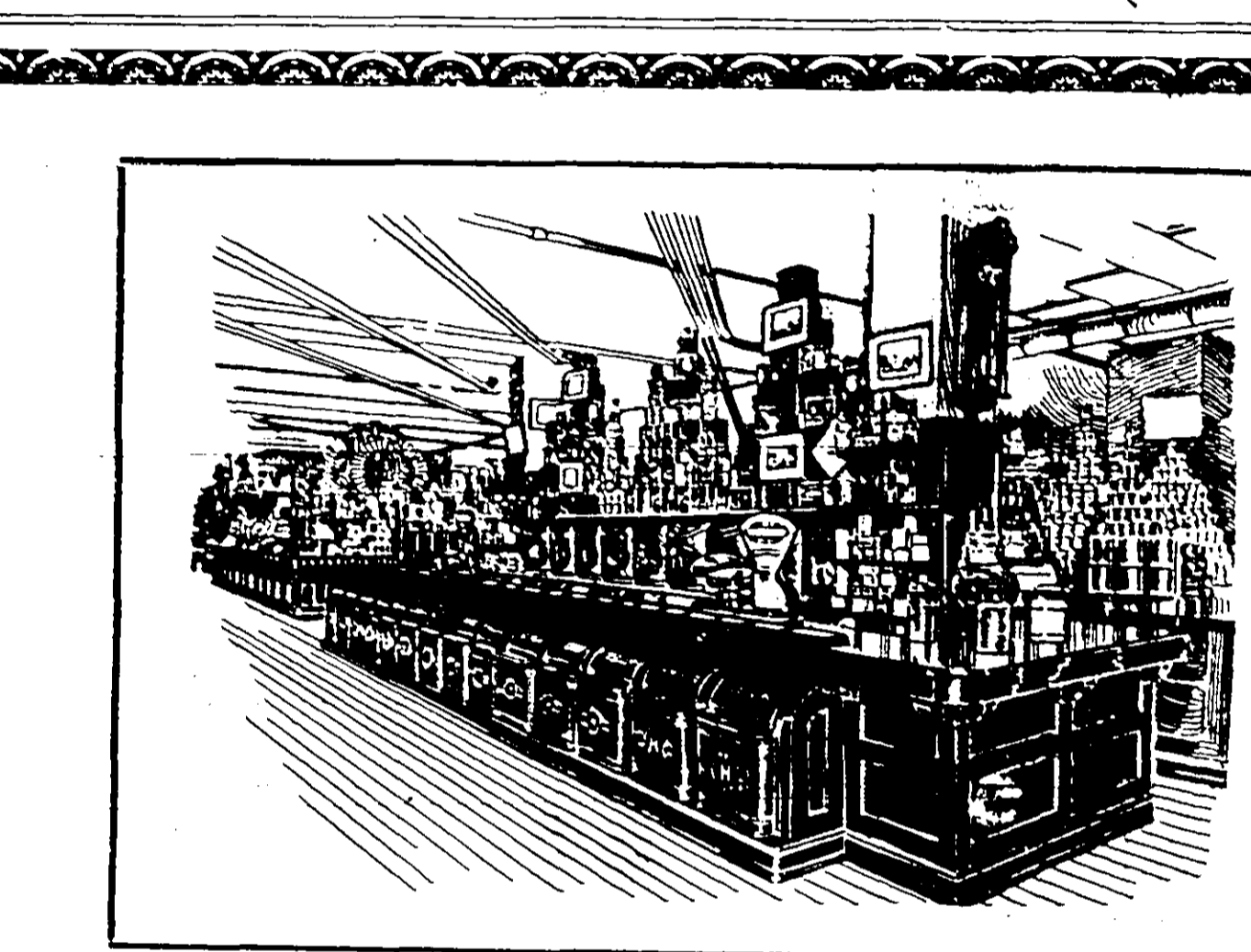
