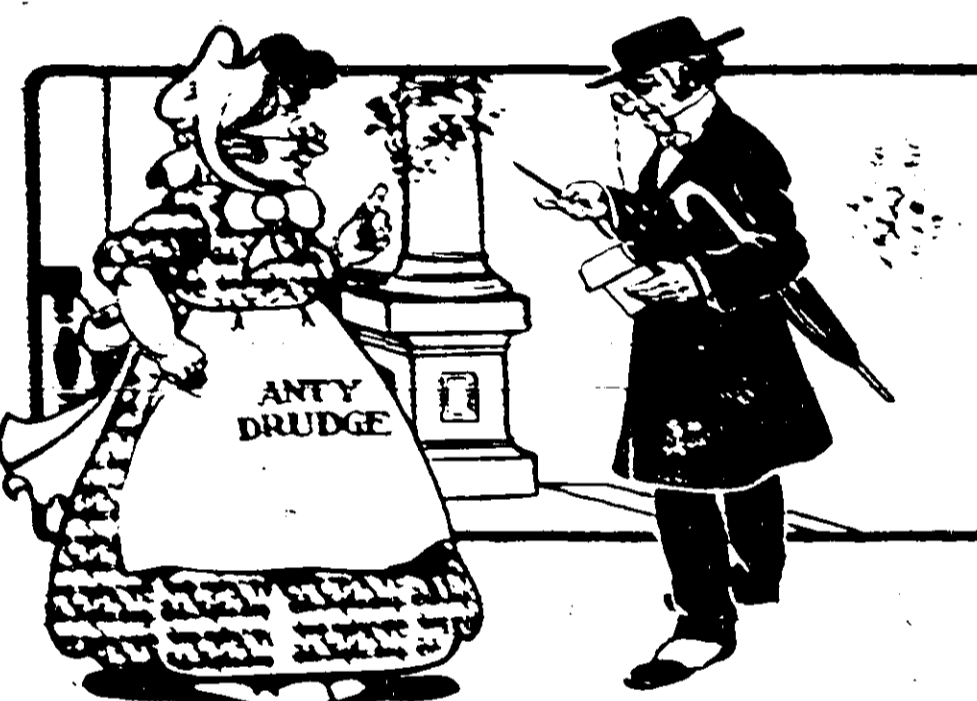

IS THE ANIMAL INSTINCT IN MAN SUPREMACY?

The Solution Lies Largely In The Individual

To the Editor of the News-Herald: Occasionally, in these days of enlightenment, the people of the United States are aroused to a considerable degree by reports of some exceptionally brutal savagery which an individual has suffered at the hands of a mob. The cause of the outbreak of primal savagery is generally an assault upon women and the victims of the mob is generally a negro. The better nature of mankind seems to be lost in the overpowering rage of the beastly and brutal. The animal instinct seems to break all before it and sweep this forgetful humanity of man. The appearance of the offending negro, with his color skin to that of the savage, seems to call forth feelings of fury and hatred and to break away as indignantly the lingering power of the law.

The scene of the murder came to the attention of the police in a new country, its people are progressive, radical, and there are no precedents, no traditions. The careless and adventurous class of the East, North, South and West unite in forming a community where the hand of justice falls quickly and mercilessly. The territory is also with the vigor and the spontaneity of a pioneer. Here the animal instinct of man is given the advantage over the human. In more conventional communities, one would argue, man has a stronger grip himself and is able to overcome the brute that is inherent in him. But nevertheless, the animal instinct rules supreme.

In Coatesville, Pa., last week there occurred one of the worst examples of mob savagery in the annals of history. The victim had killed a man who was known to the community, he had been apprehended and arrested and justice was about to take its course. But the mob, growing larger and stronger, fanned its big marchants, mounding spark of savagery, turned justice into vengeance and made a mockery of the law.

Selling the wounded negro, the infuriated mob bound him to a cart, dragged him through the streets of the town and then, having piled up four rails and having the holes in the man upon the sacrificial altar, supplied the match and waited until the impact of the brute found satisfaction in the list of the kill.

There is hardly to be found a community more stark, more peaceful, and more devoted to the ideals of peace than is that in Coatesville, Pa. It has always championed the cause of right and has stood for human equality and the supremacy of the law. But

Primal savagery will not be blotted out of human nature until each individual savages comprehend the astuteness of murder and the sacredness of death. Happily, the outlook of the Coatesville mob are growing more and more human and the trend toward a better condition of affairs is apparent. But the lynching and burning of negroes will diminish only as the better thoughts of man increase and the law of the individual, not the law of the mob, make such incidents things of the past.

When brute justice is replaced by the mercy of the profession will be solved.
