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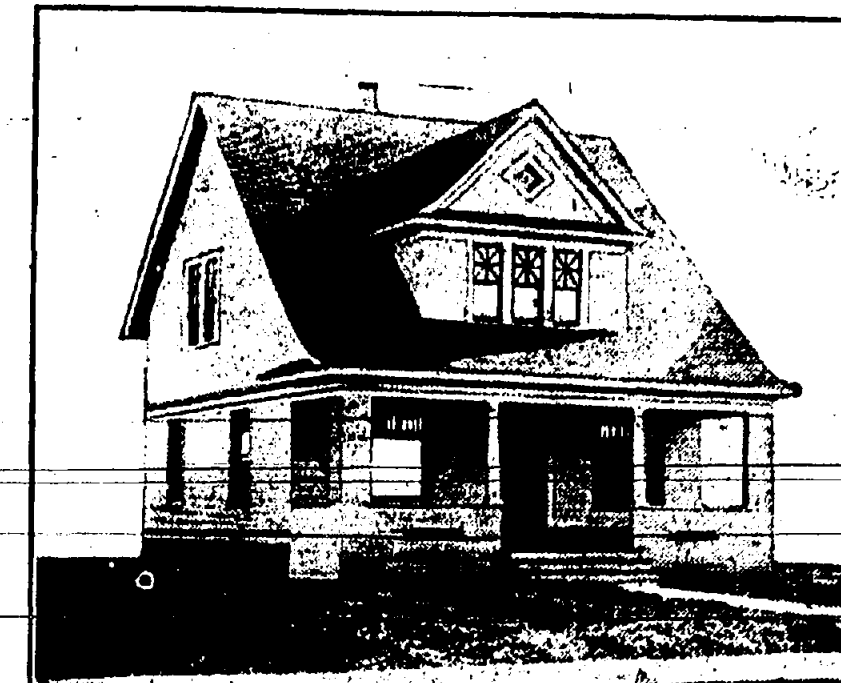
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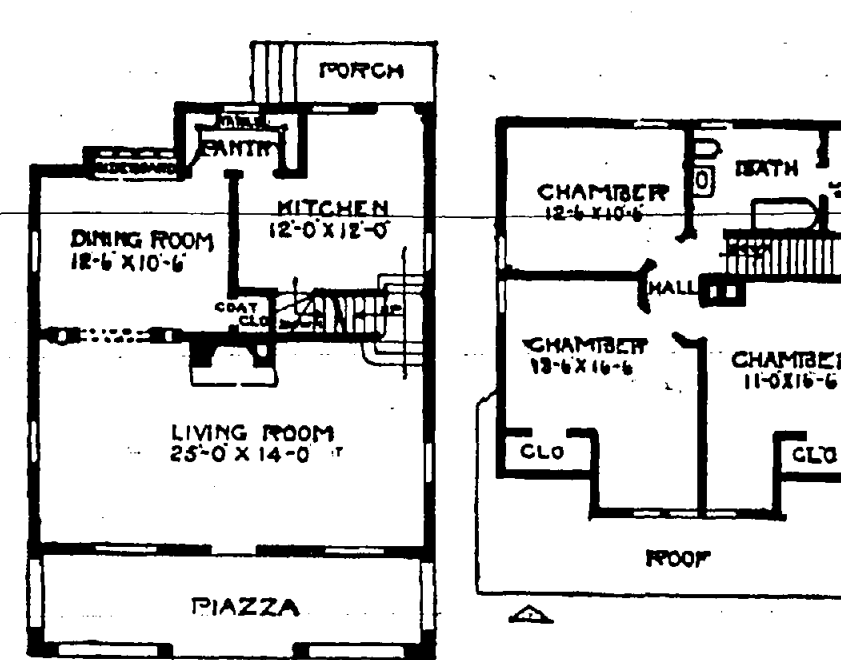

WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 3.—When the average Wisconsin business man hears Senator Robert M. La Follette denominated as a radical who is bent on destroying industries, he usually smiles, for the business man has been able to add to his business profits the amount of the protective legislation in Wisconsin.

When Governor La Follette was fighting for a railroad construction bill, the threat was made that capital would leave the state and that the railroads would stop new construction if the bill became a law.

But the railroad Commission was created. It compelled the railroads to reduce their freight and passenger tariffs, and to put better equipment on their lines. These orders from the commission emboldened Progressive men. Did the enforcement of these Progressive regulations injure the railroads? Let the figures speak for themselves.

During the last five years of the Commission's existence, it has reduced freight rates so that the freight act has saved the railroads about \$1,000,000 a year. The legislature has increased the passenger rate approximately \$200,000 a year.

During the same period the net earnings of the railroads in Wisconsin increased relatively just a little more than the net earnings of all the railroads in the United States.

The increase in Wisconsin was 11.5 per cent. In the United States it was 10.5 per cent. The increase in net earnings, after the deductions in rates, was more pronounced in Wisconsin.

These figures show that the railroads prospered also in spite of being forced to bear their just share of the taxation burden. In 1906, before Governor La Follette had put through his Progressive legislation, the railroads paid taxes amounting to \$1,711,500.

With the Progressive legislation on the statute books, the tax on the railroads increased 83 per cent. in the amount of their taxes. Between the years 1904 and 1909 the taxes of all railroads in the United States increased only 47 per cent.

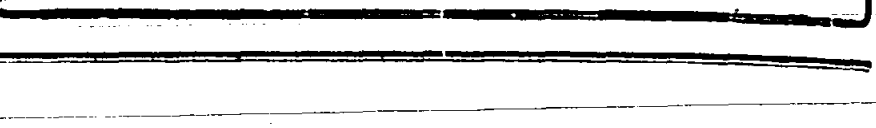
