RULE CHANGE PROPOSALS

With basketball coaches from coast to coast making proposals for rules changes during the 1946-47 season, one knows that the current court season is about at an end. Every year the coaches come up with some suggestions for rule changes, many of which are designed to improve the game, but a few of which are designed to take advantage of a situation.

One of the changes which is being proposed this year by some groups is the return of the center jump, one of the plays which figured prominently in the game of basketball as it was played back a few years. The group which wants the center jump gives as an argument that the present game is too fast for the players and as a matter of fact for some of the spectators. It is the contention of this group that the time which it takes to get the ball back to the players gets their balance and steady themselves for the next scrimmage.

There is a group which also declares that it is easier to get a rebound from the top of the court than from an out-of-bounds position at the end of the court after a foul or version of a successful attempt from the floor. This contention that the game is getting so fast that the spectators can't watch and appreciate what is happening, also has some support from certain of the more conservative coaches.

Locally, there is opposition to any change which would bring the center jump back to basketball. Coach Earl Walter for one believes that the public would never stand for a change back. He declares that what the public wants is fast and exciting. He cites the play of college teams and the crowds which the best of our institutions of higher learning draw through the turnstiles. This particular rule is good enough to stand as it, although there is room for argument.
