**POLICE ROUT BURGLAR
FROM GROSSMAN HOME**

**Timely Discovery By
Sergeant Smith Pre-
vents Any Losses**

SECOND-STORY MAN ESCAPES IN DARKNESS

Special police precautions ordered by Acting Chief of Police James Thompson in view of the numerous robberies and robbery attempts of the past twelve days last night narrowly averted thefts at the home of E. L. Grossman, member of the Sinking Fund Commission, of 179 West Michigan avenue, and almost resulted in the capture of the marauder, who is thought to have put the entire city on edge and particularly disquieted the residents of the Third Ward.

Enters Grossman Home

The home of Mr. Grossman was entered about 2:30 o'clock this morning by means of a ladder raised to the roof of a porch near the front of the house where the burglar raised an unlocked window of a room in which three boys of the family were sleeping. L. making his entry the intruder in some manner raised enough light to enable him to take up the clothing of the

ter Smith ducked into the shadow of a nearby tree and waited. In the meantime Officer Becker of the U. S. Veterans' Patrol came up West Main street avenue and joined Sergeant Smith. Together they made a search of the premises around the house to discover if the burglar had any companions, but discovered none.

Man Makes Escape

Knowing that the man was within the Grossman house, Smith started to watch while Becker went to the corner of West Millton avenue and Bryn Mawr street where he found Motorcycle Officer Frank Remer and Patrolman Flanagan. With these reinforcements it was planned to surround the

But the man evidently was aware of the officers' movements as he slipped unnoticed by any of the Grossman boys or the rest of the family down stairs from the bedroom and out the rear door. Smith's attention was attracted to the rear of the house when his quarry was making a getaway with the sound of the man—crash!—through the brush making in the direction of Elm avenue.

Smith made for the sounds, but the darkness he could not catch a glimpse of the fleeing figure and although he had his gun ready for the shot no target presented itself.
