A short boiling period in as small an amount of water as

possible in a tightly covered vessel is the recommendation for both leafy and modified leaf vegetables. For this reason the use of the pressure saucepan is advantageous. Tomatoes should be simmered. however, so that oxygen does not have an opportunity to circulate through the tomatoes and with the help of he heat destroy valuable vitamin C. - The acid in the tomatoes serves to protect the vitamin C more adequately in high temperatures and excess oxygen re avoided. In cooking fruits, much the

same principle applies And too rapid boiling also tends to cause disintegration of the fruit, resulting in a mushy or ragged appearance which is undesirable. Some varieties of apples, Macintosh for example, do dot hold their shape when cooked even in the oven. But these are one of the universal favorites for apple "sauce," where the absence of firm pieces is desirable. On the other hand, many of the pears now coming into market
