We refer to the Second Ward and especially that area in the vicinity of the apartment units in Linden ave nue. While there is a playground on Whittier street onerated by the Union County Park Commission, this is a considerable distance from this apartment house center where there is a large concentration of young children. There is a park across St. George avenue, but there is also the hazard of crossing this highway, so many of the child**ren are deprived of the opportunity to play here.**

In the interest of safety and child welfare, it becomes the duty of the city to supply some sort of recreational } **area for this group**. The area wouldn't have to be large since it would be primarily for the younger children. The older groups could go to the Rahway River Park or to the playground on Whittier street. Swings, sandboxes, slides and the usual equipment for smaller children is all that is needed in this area. We don't know what lands at available, but from the looks of the area there is space enough for such a playground provided it can be bough or leased for the purpose. The city would do well to ir vestigate this and then take the steps necessary to previde the facilities necessary.
