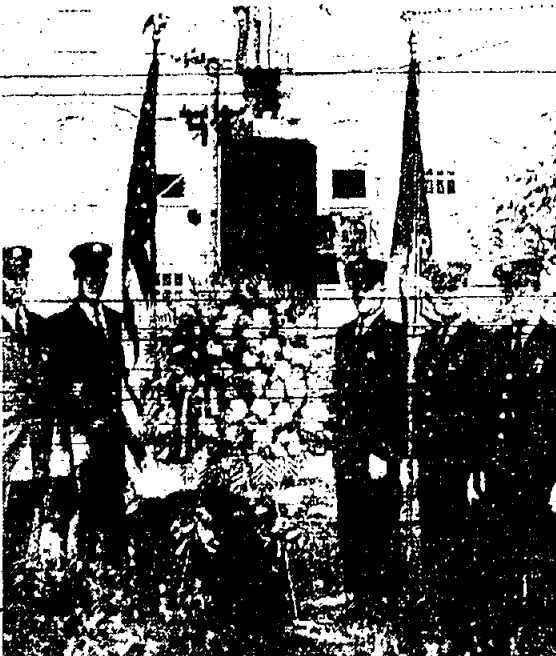
The automobile owned by John J. List of 27 David Court, Colonia, was stolen from in front of Shop-Rite market on Friday and recovered the same day in Irvington.

Event Saturday Is Highlight Of Convention

A flag-burning ceremony tonight and a parade on Saturday afternoon will be highlights of the three-day Union County American Legion Convention to which Rahway Post 5 will be the host.

The convention will open tonight at 8:45 o'clock with the "burning of the colors" ceremony off the grounds of the Legion Home on Maple Ave. Following a concert by the marching band of Carteret Post 203, all unserviceable flags to be burned as prescribed by the federal flag code.

Open House Planned By Rahway Hospital

If you're over 14, you are invited to Rahway Hospital's open house on June 14, from 1 to 3:30 p.m. and when the Board of Governors says "open house," it apparently means just that.

"This is the perfect hospital. Let them look it over," was the consensus of the board. So they're opening the doors wide and, once you're greeted by board members, you're on your own—free to wander where you please. A volunteer will be glad to show you around if you are, for, but otherwise, you can see what you want to see and every department will be manned with question-answers.

The third floor of the new wing is complete and in use and about 60 per cent of the second floor of the new wing is completed. Only the renovation area, which couldn't be touched until the new areas took the load of it, is still in the remodeling stage. The hospital staff hopes to have at least a walk-through there, so that visitors can see what is being done.

An operating room will be started with a surgeon, anesthetist, nurses and a manikin to demonstrate operating techniques. Other staff members will be on hand to explain things in the laboratory, X-ray department, dietary department, central supplies, emergency rooms, labor rooms, nursery and so on through the entire operation. Refreshments will be served in the employees cafeteria throughout the period.
